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History of Our School

Sierra Madre School was founded in 1882 as a one-room schoolhouse in the center of town, in Kersting Court. The original school bell still hangs in that location today.

The streetcar line came through town in 1905, and the school was moved to Highland and Auburn. A total renovation in 1930 created one of the most beautiful schools in the country, designed in the Spanish mission revival style.

Garden of Goodwill: The Japanese garden and koi pond were originally built by Japanese Americans in 1930, to celebrate the opening of the school at its new location. During World War II, Japanese Americans were moved to concentration camps and the garden was destroyed by vandals. In 1995 student, Natalie Sandoval and classmates partnered with landscape architect, Lew Watanabe, to recreate the lost garden. It is the jewel of the school.
