# Proposition 39 and Education Code Committee Requirements

- Education Code section 15278 et seq.

## Requirement to Establish Committee

15278(a) If a bond measure authorized pursuant to Proposition 39 is approved, the governing board of the school district shall establish and appoint members to an independent citizens' oversight committee, pursuant to Section 15282, within 60 days of the date that the governing board enters the election results on its minutes pursuant to Section 15274.

# Purpose of Committee

15278(b) The purpose of the citizens' oversight committee shall be:

- (1) to inform the public concerning the expenditure of bond revenues.
- (2) actively review and report on the proper expenditure of taxpayers' money for school construction.
- (3) advise the public as to whether a school district is in compliance with the requirements of Proposition 39.

# Purpose of Committee (continued)

15278(b) The citizens' oversight committee shall convene to provide oversight for, but not be limited to, both of the following:

- (1) Ensuring that bond revenues are expended only for the purposes described in paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of Section 1 of Article XIII A of the California Constitution, which include construction, reconstruction, rehabilitation, or replacement of school facilities, including the furnishing and equipping of school facilities, or the acquisition or lease of real property for school facilities.
- (2) Ensuring that no funds are used for any teacher or administrative salaries or other school operating expenses.

### Allowable Activities of Committee

15278(c) In furtherance of its purpose, the citizens' oversight committee may engage in any of the following activities:

- (1) Receiving and reviewing copies of the annual, independent performance audit.
- (2) Receiving and reviewing copies of the annual, independent financial audit.
- (3) Inspecting school facilities and grounds to ensure that bond revenues are expended in compliance with the requirements of paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of Section 1 of Article XIII A of the California Constitution.

# Allowable Activities of Committee (continued)

- (4) Receiving and reviewing copies of any deferred maintenance proposals or plans developed by a school district, including any reports required by Section 17584.1.
- (5) Reviewing efforts by the school district to maximize bond revenues by implementing cost-saving measures, including, but not limited to, all of the following:
- (A) Mechanisms designed to reduce the costs of professional fees.
- (B) Mechanisms designed to reduce the costs of site preparation.
- (C) Recommendations regarding the joint use of core facilities.
- (D) Mechanisms designed to reduce costs by incorporating efficiencies in schoolsite design.
- (E) Recommendations regarding the use of cost-effective and efficient reusable facility plans.

# Responsibilities of Committee, District's Administration and Board

15280(a) The governing board of the district shall, without expending bond funds, provide the citizens' oversight committee with any necessary technical assistance and shall provide administrative assistance in furtherance of its purpose and sufficient resources to publicize the conclusions of the citizens' oversight committee.

# Responsibilities of Committee, District's Administration and Board (continued)

15280(b) All committee proceedings shall be open to the public and notice to the public shall be provided in the same manner as the proceedings of the governing board. The citizens' oversight committee shall issue regular reports on the results of its activities. A report shall be issued at least once a year. Minutes of the proceedings of the citizens' oversight committee and all documents received and reports issued shall be a matter of public record and be made available on an Internet website maintained by the governing board.

# Composition of Committee

15282(a) The citizens' oversight committee shall consist of at least seven members who shall serve for a minimum term of two years without compensation and for no more than three consecutive terms.

# Composition of Committee (continued)

15282(a) While consisting of a minimum of at least seven members, the citizens' oversight committee shall be comprised, as follows:

- (1) One member shall be active in a business organization representing the business community located within the school district.
- (2) One member shall be active in a senior citizens' organization.
- (3) One member shall be active in a bona fide taxpayers' organization.

# Composition of Committee (continued)

- (4) One member shall be the parent or guardian of a child enrolled in the school district.
- (5) One member shall be both a parent or guardian of a child enrolled in the school district and active in a parent-teacher organization, such as the Parent Teacher Association or schoolsite council.

# Consequences of Failure to Comply

15284(a) A citizen residing in the school district that is assessed and liable for ad valorem taxes on real property in the school district or who paid such tax within one year of the action, may obtain an order restraining and preventing any expenditure of funds received by a school district through the sale of bonds authorized by Proposition 39 against any officer, agent, or other person acting on behalf of, that school district, if it appears by the complaint or affidavits that any of the following conditions are present:

# Consequences of Failure to Comply (continued)

- (1) An expenditure of funds received by a school district through the sale of bonds authorized by this chapter is for purposes other than those specified in paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of Section 1 of Article XIII A of the California Constitution.
- (2) The expenditure is not in compliance with paragraph (3) of subdivision
- (b) of Section 1 of Article XIII A of the California Constitution.
- (3) That an expenditure in violation of paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of Section 1 of Article XIII A of the California Constitution will be made or will continue to be made during the litigation that would produce waste or great or irreparable injury.
- (4) The governing board of a school district has willfully failed to appoint the citizens' oversight committee in violation of the requirements of Section 15278.

**Recommendation:** The Board of Education approves the adoption of a resolution No. 2428 authorizing additional payment to Clark Seif Clark, Inc. for additional asbestos consulting services relating to asbestos and lead abatement monitoring for the Blair High School Modernization Project.

**District Priority/Strategy:** To ensure a clean, safe, and orderly environment that supports learning.

#### I. BACKGROUND

District issued purchase order #82583 authorizing payment in the amount of \$43,400.00 to Clark Seif Clark for asbestos consulting Services (proposal dated April 7, 2017) for the Blair High School Modernization project ("Project"). Subsequent to the issuance of the purchase order, District staff determined that the Project requires additional monitoring and testing during the hazardous material removal phase of the Project due to unforeseen conditions and the discovery of additional materials (the "Additional Work"). Clark Seif Clark has provided a proposal for this Additional Work in the amount of \$85,357.00.

#### II. STAFF ANALYSIS

Because of its work on the Project through the purchase order, Clark Seif Clark is intimately familiar with the Project and is ready, willing and able to perform the Additional Work. Therefore, the competitive bid process would not provide any benefit to the District and would instead force the District to incur unnecessary cost and would delay the completion of the Project. As explained in the resolution, the District is not obligated to complete the competitive bid process when such a process would work an incongruity or not produce any advantage for the District.

# RESOLUTION FOR APPROVAL OF ADDITIONAL PAYMENT TO CLARK SEIF CLARK, INC. FOR CERTAIN ADDITIONAL WORK AT BLAIR HIGH SCHOOL

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 2428**

- **WHEREAS**, the Governing Board of the Pasadena Unified School District ("District") previously entered into an agreement whereby Clark Seif Clark, Inc. ("CSC") provided consultant services related to asbestos and lead abatement monitoring at Blair High School ("Project");
- **WHEREAS**, after CSC began work on the Project, the District discovered unforeseen conditions and additional material on the Project that requires additional monitoring and testing services (the "Additional Work"), more fully set forth in Exhibit "A" (the "Additional Work Proposal");
- **WHEREAS**, CSC is intimately familiar with the Project and is ready, willing and able to perform the the Additional Work;
- **WHEREAS,** the total cost for the Additional Work is \$84,357.00 and exceeds the limitations set forth in Public Contract Code section 20118.4;
- **WHEREAS,** Public Contract Code section 20111(c) and Government Code section 53060 states that the competitive bidding requirements do not apply to professional or special services or advice;
- **WHEREAS,** it would be more costly and time-consuming to bid the Additional Work since it is integral to the Project and the work performed by CSC;
- **WHEREAS**, competitive bidding the Additional Work would result in the delay of the completion of the Project;
- **WHEREAS**, the Additional Work must be performed before the Project can be completed and failure to complete the Project will disrupt the education of students;
- **WHEREAS**, it would work an incongruity and not produce any advantage to the District to competitively bid the Additional Work since such competitive bid work could result in multiple contractors being required to perform work more efficiently and effectively performed by CSC; and
- WHEREAS, Meakin v. Steveland (1977) 68 Cal.App.3d 490 and Los Angeles Dredging v. Long Beach (1930) 210 Cal. 348 holds that statutes requiring competitive bidding do not

apply when competitive bidding would work an incongruity or not produce any advantage.

#### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

The Board of Trustee of Pasadena Unified School District hereby declares

- **Section 1.** The above recitals are all true and correct.
- **Section 2.** That it would work an incongruity and not produce any advantage to the District to competitively bid the completion of the Additional Work.
- <u>Section 3.</u> That the District approves the immediate completion of Additional Work without competitively bidding such work and approves the District's payment to CSC in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in the Additional Work Proposal.
- **Section 4.** That the completion and approval of the Additional Work is necessary to ensure completion of the Project and use of the facilities by students and staff.
- <u>Section 5.</u> That the Governing Board delegates to its Superintendent or a designee, authority to execute all agreements and complete all necessary documents for the Additional Work and to otherwise fulfill the intent of this Resolution.
  - **Section 6.** That this Resolution shall be effective as of the date of its adoption.

**Topic:** <u>APPROVAL TO ACCEPT BID NO #C06-16/17 NORMA COOMBS ELEMENTARY</u> SCHOOL KILN ROOM PROJECT AS COMPLETE.

**RECOMMENDATION:** The Governing Board of Pasadena Unified School District approves to accept CUPCCAA Bid No. C06-16/17 -Norma Coombs Elementary School Kiln Room as Complete.

**District Priority/Strategy:** To ensure a clean, safe, and orderly environment that supports learning.

#### I. BACKGROUND

At Norma Coombs School, in support of the school's ceramic's program, a new kiln room is needed to house the programs ceramics kilns. Six (6) contractors attended the Mandatory Pre-Bid Site Meeting on May 17, 2017. The scope of work included the construction of the room and the installation of two new electric kilns. The apparent lowest responsive Bid was awarded to Amazing Electric in the amount of \$ 112,000.00.

#### II. STAFF ANALYSIS

District Facilities staff has determined that all work at Norma Coombs Elementary School construction and installation of the new kilns is complete and recommends that the Board of Education accept the work completed by Amazing Electric as complete. The Board is requested to direct staff to file the Notice of Completion (NOC) with the County Clerk's office for CUPCCAA Bid No. C06-16/17.

The Facilities Committee vetted this Board Report on November 16, 2017.

#### III. FISCAL IMPACT

The total construction cost for this project was \$112,000.00 paid out of the Measure TT- Norma Coombs project.

# BOARD OF EDUCATION PASADENA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT PASADENA, CALIFORNIA

**Topic:** APPROVAL OF MTT PRIORITY LIST OF PROJECTS

**RECOMMENDATION:** The Board of Education approves the Measure TT Priority List of Projects. This is the Facilities Construction Master Plan for the remaining of the MTT Budget.

**District Priority/Strategy:** To ensure a clean, safe, and orderly environment that supports learning.

#### I. BACKGROUND

Since 2008, the District has used Funds from the Measure TT Bond according to the TT Bond objectives, with an approximate remaining balance of approximately \$104,666,034, as of October 12, 2017. From the last Special Facilities Committee Meeting (November 9, 2017) attachment is the Facilities Construction Master Plan being proposed for approval for the remaining of the MTT Budget.

In summary, the following new proposed items of priority to be discussed and approved:

- A) Priority #1 to #9 approved to move forward including #2b the PHS Campus Appearance Identity.
- B) Priority #10 is the addition of three portable classrooms at Jackson and to include the construction of the student drop-off area.
- C) Priority #11 is to start the repairs of the site HVAC needs to maintain and/or replace the units that are in need of repair.
- D) Priority #12 is replacement and repairs of the school playgrounds
- E) Priority #13 A lists of site needs will be consolidated to include the sites that need shade structures.
- F) Priority #14 the site beautification lists to include the irrigation repairs and look into a water wise grass lawn concept. The approved AR 3511 s and DSA PR 15-03 requirements is also attached for information only (this list will be prioritized in order of need).

The Modernization of Don Benito, Roosevelt and Longfellow are not recommended to move forward under this Bond. The DSA for plans for these sites will continue the DSA approval process and will not be bid-out for construction.

At the Special Board Meeting (April 23, 2017, District staff submitted the 2017 Facilities Master Plan which included in it, the MTT Projects & Future List of Priorities; this list was

intended to show a tentative order in which projects would be executed with the available/remaining MTT funds. Since its original presentation to the Board), several modifications to the list were received from staff and feedback from Board Members that resulted in its final draft form that was discussed at the last Special Facilities Committee meeting (November 9, 2017), staff is submitting to the Board for approval for approval (see attachments).

#### II. STAFF ANALYSIS

Staff is recommending approval as the Facilities Master Plan for the expenditure of remainder of the MTT Bond Funds voted by the tax payers in 2008 election.

The Facilities Committee vetted this Board Report on November 16, 2017.
