Arts Integration

Art as Curriculum

If a school has a music, art, drama, or dance teacher, their approach is most likely and primarily Arts as Curriculum. Students develop knowledge and skills in a particular art form. Often referred to as "arts learning" or "art for art's sake," the programs are guided by national, state, or local standards for each of the art forms. For example, in visual arts, students learn the content, processes, and techniques for two- or three-dimensional work. They learn how the visual arts developed and changed throughout history, and engage in creating and analyzing works created in a variety of media.

Arts-Enhanced Curriculum

When the arts are used as a device or strategy to support other curriculum areas, but no objectives in the art form are explicit, then the approach is called Arts-Enhanced Curriculum. For example, students sing the ABCs as a means to other ends—remembering the letters and sequence of the alphabet. However, students are not usually expected to learn about melody, song structure, or develop specific singing skills. Arts-Enhanced Curriculum acts as a "hook" to engage students in learning content. Additionally, teachers need little or no training in the art form. Arts-Enhanced Curriculum is often mistaken for Arts-Integrated Curriculum or a distinction is not made between the two.



Arts-Integrated Curriculum


In Arts-Integrated Curriculum, the arts become the approach to teaching and the vehicle for learning. Students meet dual learning objectives when they engage in the creative process to explore connections between an art form and another subject area to gain greater understanding in both. For example, students meet objectives in theater (characterization, stage composition, action, expression) and in social studies. The experience is mutually reinforcing—creating a dramatization provides an authentic context for students to learn more about the social studies content and as students delve deeper into the social studies content their growing understandings impact their dramatizations. For Arts-Integrated Curriculum to result in deep student understanding in both the art form and the other curriculum area, it requires that teachers engage in professional development to learn about arts standards and how to connect the arts to the curriculum they teach.



School Information

School Uniform/ Dress Code

The MKS community supports the uniform dress code policy. The dress code requires all elementary students to dress in white, black, or red tops with black or khaki bottoms.

The acceptable "tops" for elementary students are:

- Polo-type shirts
- Full cut standard shirts with white collars
- Turtlenecks
- McKinley wear
- All of the above must be red, black, navy, or white

The acceptable "bottoms" for elementary students are:

- Pants, shorts, skirts, or jumpers
- Blue jeans are allowed
- All of the above must be black, navy, khaki, or jeans


Please support McKinley's dress code policy by requiring your child/children wear the uniform everyday.

School Times


We have two start times. Middle School begins at 8:25 am M-F. Elementary School begins at 8:45 am M-F with Morning Round Up at 8:35 am. On Monday school ends at 1:30 pm for all students and dismissal is at 3:10 pm Tues-Fri for all students. If you come to sign your child out early, you will need to show a government-issued ID. Please note, no students are signed out within 20 minutes of the end of the school day.

Arrival and Dismissal Procedures

Middle School students must be in the Middle School courtyard by 8:20 am so that they can head into the hallways on that first bell. All elementary students, including Tk/Kinder should meet their teachers at Round Up every day. This is where parents will drop students and depart campus after Round Up. Be sure to allow time to park and walk into the center of campus to be at Round Up at 8:35 am for elementary. Morning valet drop off is off of the El Molino staff lot. Please do not park in staff parking spaces in the morning. We do not have enough spots for all employees so parents taking those spots causes distress to our faculty as they arrive in the morning.

Please ensure you've signed up for Valet if that is your dismissal selection. Teachers will record the after-school option for each student: Walkers, Valet, or which after school program your child attends. Any changes need to be communicated to teachers in advance. Valet parents should line up along El Molino to pick up your student at the north end of the staff lot. Kinder Walkers meet at the Auditorium Door. Have your Tag and ID ready every day. All other Walkers dismiss through the Breezeway Gate and parents can meet there in the lawn along Oak Knoll.

After School Clubs and Enrichment

MKS has three after school programs that operate 12:35-6:00 pm on Monday and 2:15-6:00 pm Tuesday-Friday.

PasadenaLEARNs

Pasadena LEARNs is an after school program hosted on Willard's campus. Students take enrichment classes called clubs. LEARNs is accepting applications for 2018-2019 including applications for their new Extended Program. The Extended Program is fee-based and has no minimum attendance requirements. Applications are available at the LEARNs office at Willard.

Meals

Breakfast begins every day at 8:05. Breakfast costs \$1.75 and lunch costs \$2.60 and milk or juice is \$.50 Free and reduced lunch applications are available in our office and on-line at www.applyforlunch.com. Families can now pay for school lunch on-line at www.myschoolbucks.com.

School Supplies

- Class supplies and individual student supplies are posted each summer on the school web site.
- School supply donations are welcomed. Please ask the teacher or see the teacher's wish list in the information that comes home in the packet of information on the first day of school.

Communications

There are several locations for key information at McKinley. All families will receive a Sunday evening phone call and email from MKS Administration. We will also use the Messenger feature to send key texts for critical information midweek. You should also consider signing up to follow the school and our key parent groups on Facebook and the Remind App. We also announce key

information through our school web site, Peach Jar, and the district app. It is important that you read the Sunday emails/listen to the Sunday call and choose the other forms of communication that work best for you.

Additionally, Students bring home classroom folders on Tuesdays and Thursdays in elementary school and each teacher maintains a web site, classroom Facebook page, class emails, and/or Remind to communicate directly with families. The PTA is also deploying room parents this year to share key information about the class and school events with parents.

Facebook

Our official Facebook page is maintained by Administration and Office Staff. It has photos and reminders that helps families stay connected to MKS. There are also family-based pages and most teachers have an official classroom Facebook page.

Peach Jar

On our website you can sign up to receive digital flyers through the "Peach Jar" link. Electronic versions of flyers are posted under the "Peach Jar" tab on the website.

Phone Messages

The Principal, Ms. Duquette, sends out a recorded phone call to all McKinley families each Sunday night during the school year highlighting events and important announcements for the upcoming week at MKS. Additional recorded phone calls from the school, PTA, AAPC, Arts Council, Equity, SSC, and district are sent to families as needed throughout the year. We ask that families please do not call the classrooms directly from 8:25-3:10pm during instructional time.

The process of making up classes begins in May. Our goals are to achieve academic, behavior, and boy/girl balance of classes, to make up satisfactory combination classes and to provide for individual student needs. Class placements are posted at the Welcome Back Event before school begins each August.


Lost and Found

Lost items are stored in the Multipurpose Room. Don't forget to swing by and check for that lost lunch box, sweater, or jacket. Lost cell phones and chromebooks are always stored in the safe in the front office.

Lunch, Snacks, and Water (Including Prohibited Items)

Please see the enclosed schedule for lunch times by grade level. You should expect your students to get used to that lunch time and they may ask for lunch at that time on the weekends too! You may either send your student with their lunch each morning or they can purchase lunch in our cafeteria. If you are purchasing lunch, please open an account with the cafeteria manager. Students eat together as a class each day and our cafeteria is peanut-free. If your child has a peanut allergy, please notify the classroom teacher and Principal Duquette so that we can ensure a peanut-free zone at your child's lunch table. Important reminders: no outside food deliveries or lunches (pizzas, McDonalds, etc) can be delivered to students to eat in the pergola. Snacks and Water are welcome. Students have the opportunity to eat their snack at morning recess/nutrition break and some classrooms also arrange classroom snacks. Water Bottles are encouraged for all grade levels.

Important Reminder regarding free and reduced lunch. Applications must be submitted each year. They do not automatically renew. Households wishing to apply for meal benefits must complete an application for all children at home and return it to the Office of Food and Nutrition Services at 740 W. Woodbury Ave, Pasadena, CA 91103. For a simple and safe method to apply, use our online application at www.MySchoolApps.com. Contact Grace Aguilar at 626-396-5852



x89371 for help and complete the application. The Office of Food and Nutrition will inform you if your application is approved or denied for free meals or reduced-price meals.

Please note, parents are not permitted to purchase outside food and deliver it to the school for a student to eat at lunch. Additionally, Flaming Hot Cheetos/Takis, energy drinks, and sugary beverages and snacks are not permitted on campus at any time.

Deliveries

Any item delivered to a student will remain in the office until a pass can be sent for the student to pick it up at recess, lunch, or after school. The only item delivered during the school day is a middle school chromebook.

Birthdays


Students are not permitted to have classroom parties or pass out cake, pies, treats, etc to their classmates on their birthdays. Each teacher has a unique way to honor your child's birthday and all birthdays are announced at Morning Round Up/Announcements. Students may not take cupcakes, balloons, etc to class. Parents are welcome to provide a healthy snack to the teacher and the teacher can pass it out at morning recess.

Classroom Volunteering

We Love Volunteers! Please Get Involved. Our fabulous community assistant, Ms. Aguilar is happy to clear you to volunteer and match you with a volunteering opportunity that works for you. You can volunteer in the classrooms, through a parent group, in the front office, or to help out with morning and dismissal. But in order to volunteer, you must be cleared by Ms. Aguilar. She is available Monday-Friday and is an excellent resource to all McKinley families. One special note for our Middle School parents, classroom volunteering is not common in middle school and most students beg that we not have their parent volunteer in class. Oh middle school, such a special time! So wee are always happy to help our middle school parents find new and other ways to engage.

Back to School Night

This year's Back to School Night is September 13th. This is an evening for parents only and is an opportunity for you to learn about the academic program for the year from your child's teacher, what teacher expectations are, and what volunteer needs your teacher may have. You can also ask questions of your child's teacher. We will also host tables for all of our key parent groups and critical campus clubs.



School Rules and Policies

Attendance- Absence from school, regardless of the reason limits your child's educational opportunities and can negatively affect his/ her grades and academic achievement.

Notification of Absences- If your child is absent please call 626.396.5630 or provide a written excuse from home when returning to school. Excused absences include: illness, quarantine, doctor's appointment, attending a funeral, religious holiday/ exercises, and others per EC 46014 and 48205. Per EC 48260, EC 48261, & EC 48263 a student is considered truant after three tardies of more than 30 minutes each time or after three absences without valid excuses.

Teachers will provide students with opportunities to make up classwork and homework in a timely manner. Students and teachers will collaborate to ensure that students have a reasonable amount of time to make up all work. Parents are notified by teachers about the status of make-up work. Students are not punished with a loss of grade points on make-up work. No student may have his/her grade reduced or lose academic credit for any excused absence when missed assignments and tests are satisfactorily completed within a reasonable amount of time.

Extended Absence- If you know that your child will be absent for 5 or more consecutive days, please contact the office so we can arrange an Independent Study Agreement.

Tardies- Students arriving after the tardy bell are tardy. Each tardy means valuable instructional time is lost. If your child is tardy he or she should report to the office for a tardy slip.

Visitors on Campus- All visitors must sign in at the main office when they arrive and sign out when they leave. This policy is for the safety of students, visitors, and staff. The school needs to know who is on campus at all times. All visitors must wear a badge while on school grounds. This badge lets the other adults on campus know that you have signed in. If you'd like to visit your child's classroom, please arrange the visit 24 hours in advance with the classroom teacher.

Classroom Observations- Any parent or guardian who wishes to observe their child in their classroom needs to contact the principal directly (duquette.nicole@pusd.us) to arrange the observation. According to Governing Board Policy, a classroom observation must be prearranged, last for no more than 20 minutes, and be at a time that is agreeable to the classroom teacher. While administration makes every effort to arrange the observation as quickly as possible, it may take up to two weeks to observe.


School Discipline Philosophy- The goal of McKinley's Essential Agreements is to maintain a safe school environment, which promotes academic achievement and feelings of safety, respectfulness, and responsibility. At all times, McKinley students are expected to exhibit the attitudes of Tiger, taking care of their peers, their teacher, their classroom, and themselves. The school staff has collaborated to adopt school-wide guidelines of expected behavior for all of its



locations. Our aim is to develop a school that is safe, respectful, and responsible. The following guidelines have been developed.

Rewards for appropriate behavior may include being recognized as a role model for other students; earning positions of responsibility and leadership; receiving a positive referral or call home; obtaining public recognition; earning Fun Friday time; and having personal satisfaction for doing the right thing.


Consequences for misbehavior may include a verbal warning, loss of special classroom privileges, a student/ parent/teacher conference; referral to Guidance Assistant, referral to the Principal, and/ or suspension from school.



Umbrella Rule- When no rule exists, follow the directions/decisions of the playground supervisor or teacher.

Special Programs

Chromebooks- Students use chromebooks weekly in elementary school and daily in middle school. All Middle School Students receive a take-home chromebook. Students will use technology to research, write, publish, and present using google docs and slideshows. Students



collaborate using google docs and they create their own class quizzes using clever new web interfaces like Kahoot.

English Language Learners- English Learners are assessed using the CELDT annually to measure language acquisition. English Learners are instructed during designated ELD time and language supports using language objectives to support language demands during content area instruction.

Library

Look for a letter from the Beehive announcing guest authors, book drives, and other special events. MKS has a part-time librarian, and students visit the library biweekly. Students are also able to visit during recesses with a pass. The Beehive is full of rich nonfiction texts to support research and inquiry. There are also wonderful fiction titles to nurture the love of stories. With over 15,000 texts we have an expanded program including the ability to borrow library books from the Pasadena public library.


Math Field Day- 4th -8th grade students from each school work together in teams to compete in a district-wide math competition. Students prepare for the event two months before the competition to hone their math skills and build their team.

Special Education

The Pasadena Unified School District provides Special Education Services to children identified as having special needs as young as two years old. The extent of participation in services is dependent on individual needs and may range from weekly speech therapy to sessions to ongoing Resource Specialist Program (RSP) services to placement in a Special Education Classroom. Parents or guardians who feel that their child might need Special Education services should talk first to their child's teacher or with school administrators so that a referral can be made.

GATE- 2nd 8th grade students may be designated as GATE learners. They will receive differentiation and extension through a structured, purposeful inquiry that engages students in their own learning. Bi-monthly information is shared with parents on how their GATE child is receiving differentiation. Additionally, there are also opportunities for enrichment after school as well.

My Masterpieces: Discovering Art in My Community- My Masterpieces is an award winning program of the Pasadena Educational Foundation, operated in partnership with Pasadena Unified School District and ten museums and arts organizations. Students visit local treasures like Kidspace Museum (Kindergarten), Huntington (1st grade), City of Pasadena Public Art Walking



Tour (2nd grade), Gamble House (3rd grade), Pasadena Museum of History (4th grade), and Norton Simon (5th grade).

Music- At McKinley there are many options to learn about international cultures through music. Music instruction is intertwined with mathematical reasoning. We value and encourage music education.

- **Grade Level Shows-** All TK-5th graders at McKinley receive choral, dance, and choreography instruction and perform in annual grade level shows. Additionally, 6-8th graders may enroll in the choir elective.
- **Musical Instruments-** All 3rd grade-5th grade students receive instrumental instruction from the school's instrumental music instructor.
- Orchestra/ Band- Students in 2-8th grade may participate in the after school orchestra course. Additionally, 6-8th grades may enroll in the band elective.

Rose Bowl Aquatics- Third grade students visit the Rose Bowl Aquatics center to take swim lessons. Swim lessons span three weeks. Students at all ability levels are instructed by expert swim teachers to expand their swimming abilities.

Homework Policy

Pasadena Unified School District has developed homework policy and guidelines based on evidenced-based research, the purpose of homework is:

- To practice skills or reinforce knowledge that has been learned in the classroom in order to help students master a specific skill
- To reflect on what was learned in the classroom
- To be used as a way for students to prepare for future classroom activities
- To transfer knowledge and extend skills learned in one context or subject area to another situation

Statutory Councils
