We offer enrichment classes during the school day in math, language arts, science, and the arts. Children receive individualized learning to meet their needs from our resource teachers, guidance counselor, and community volunteers. Our students have daily access to Chrome Books for research, keyboarding, and educational resources. Top Reasons to Choose Don Benito

1. **We have a beautifully diverse student body.** Our students come from various ethnicities, cultures, and socio-economic backgrounds. Our students embrace and celebrate our differences.

2. **Our school culture is wholesome and “family-centered”.** Don Benito Bobcats look out for one another with PRIDE, ensuring that everyone embodies our school expectations to be safe, respectful, responsible, and productive. We have open lines of communication with our families and foster healthy partnerships. Our students, families, and staff genuinely have each other’s best interest at heart.

3. **We are a school with a lot of parent support and volunteers to help our students succeed.** For the past 2 years, we averaged 9,000 volunteer hours per year. In addition, for the past 3 years, our PTA averaged 500 members, the second highest percentage in the district.

4. **We have a dedicated staff committed to every child.** All our teachers are fully credentialed and the majority holds advanced degrees (Masters, Administrative credentials, etc.).

5. **Our students have access to rich learning experiences applicable to 21st Century expectations.**

Students in Kinder through 5th grade use Chromebooks daily. We have a 2 to 1 Chromebook to student ratio in grades Kinder through 3rd. All 4th and 5th graders have their own Chromebook for daily use.

Students learn about Microsoft Word, Excel, PowerPoint, keyboarding, and other functions at computer lab once a week.

Students attend Choral Music class once a week to learn about rhythm, beat, breathing control, etc.

Students have Instrumental Music as an elective in 4th and 5th grade. All third grade students are introduced to instrumental music with violin and recorders.

Students take art lessons from docents in our designated Art Studio.

Students explore science through hands-on experiments in our Science Center.

6. **Every grade level attends at least 3 field trips per year** to apply and transfer their learning to the real world.

7. **Student leadership development is one of our priorities.**
