ARTCENTER FOR TEENS: Summer term is 10 weeks long, starting June 1. COMMUNITY WORKS: As a nonprofit in Pasadena that provides educational opportunities and engaging community spaces for teachers, parents, youth and children, we provide Tutoring, Homework Assistance and Academic Coaching for 3rd -12th graders and Homework Circle for 1st – 2nd graders. Enrichment Classes include 3D Printing Class, a workshop where middle school students will learn new and exciting 3D printing technology; Middle School Math: Foundation Building, a middle school math support class; and Mavis Beacon Typing Class for 4th-12th graders. We offer free college and career counseling by appointment with our counselor, Mike Toro, as well as SAT Prep twice a week for high school students. Our English as a Second Language (ESL) for Adults Class includes instruction in reading, writing and speaking. This class is free for any adult.
