#### **Facts about our International Students**

- 43.5 % of our students are Guatemalan 23.9% are Honduran 15.2% are Mexican.
- 46.3% of our students are female while 53.7 are male.
- 28% of our students speak Mam.
- 30% of our students work.
- 57% of our students did not attend school during Covid.
- 40% of our students have 1 year of interrupted schooling, 17% have 2 years,
   15% less than a year, and 10% have 5 years.

### What Makes the International Academy Unique

- Wrap-around approach
- Extensive experience with servicing newcomer students.
- Stable staff, with a minimum of eight years of continuous teaching within the program
- Involvement in all aspects that facilitate transition into the country such as: legal, medical, and mental health.
- Strong home-school connection to get a better understanding of the whole student.
- Established connections with a variety of community and civil service partnerships.
- Scaffolded curriculum and computer based learning that meets their specific needs.
- Ongoing procurement of monies through grants and private donors.
- We currently serve approx. 160 students that we continue to monitor and support until they graduate or leave Blair.

#### **Future Goals**

- -Minimize the barriers that impede our student's ability to reach their maximum potential.
- -Streamline the program so that it runs more efficiently and that the processes are reliable and consistent.
- -Revise our curriculum and practices to provide better services for our Students with Formal Interrupted Education (SIFE).
- -Improve the collection of data to gather information that will help us make informed decisions.
- -Construct a plan to engage parents/guardians by educating and providing them opportunities to participate fully in their students' education.
- -Improve our graduation rate.


