TEXT (select text from book to annotate)	Missing or unclear	Quoted text lacks connection to commentary and is inadequately cited (use page numbers, quotation marks, ellipsis, or brackets)	Quoted text adequately supports commentary and is adequately cited (use page numbers, quotation marks, ellipsis, or brackets)	Quoted text clearly supports a connection to commentary and is correctly cited (use page numbers, quotation marks, ellipsis, or brackets)	Quoted text illustrates a strong connection to commentary and is correctly cited (use page numbers, quotation marks, ellipsis, or brackets)
ANNOTATION (comment on selected text)	Missing or unclear	Commentary: sparse, incomplete annotations on few pages; negligible evidence of thought or comprehension	Commentary: some annotations, but not well spaced across ten pages; little evidence of comprehension	Commentary: annotation spaced across ten pages; clear, evidence of adequate comprehension	Commentary: annotations well spaced at least 10 pages apart;; lucid, thoughtful, evidence of superior comprehension
