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Introduction & Overview

The Arts Education Profile collected information about current arts education infrastructure including arts instruction, teachers and professional development from participating school districts and charter school organizations. Three data sources informed the Arts Education Profile:

- A survey of district superintendents,
- A survey of school principals, and
- Secondary data available through the California Department of Education.

Superintendents and principals were asked to complete the survey reflecting information from the 2016-2017 school year.

This profile is intended to inform a school district or charter school organization's efforts to increase the quality, quantity and equitable access to arts education offered to students in their schools.

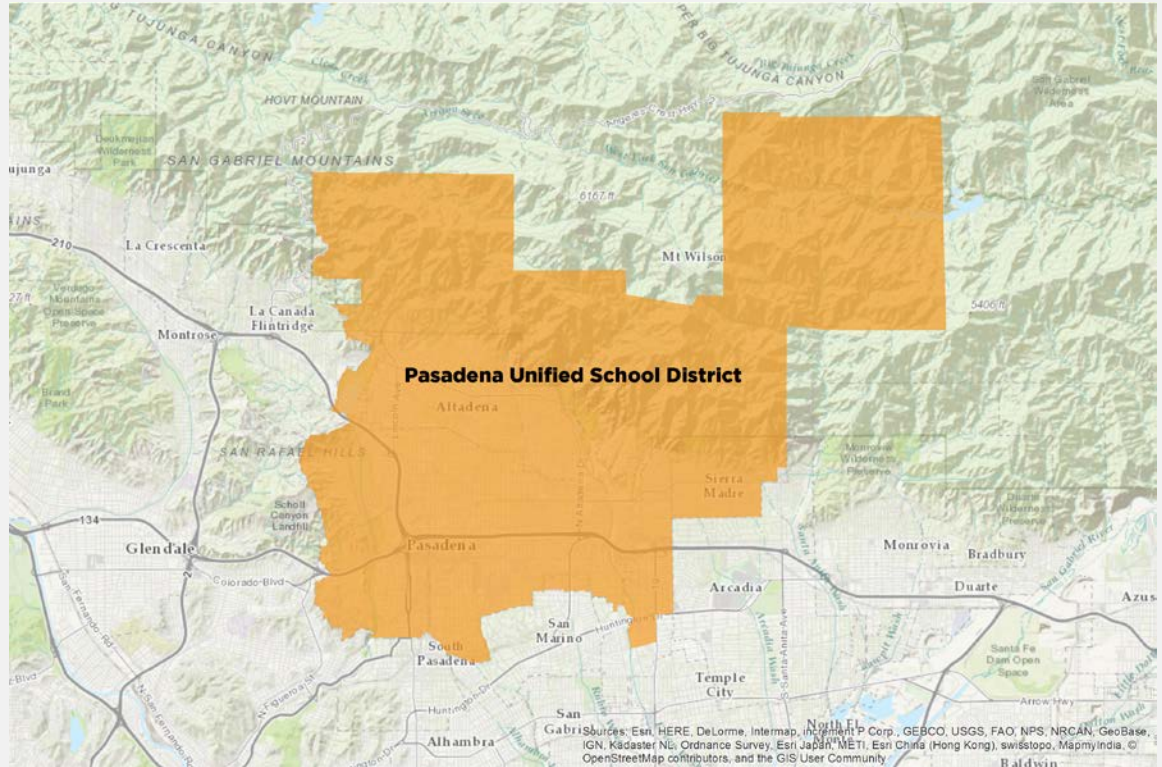

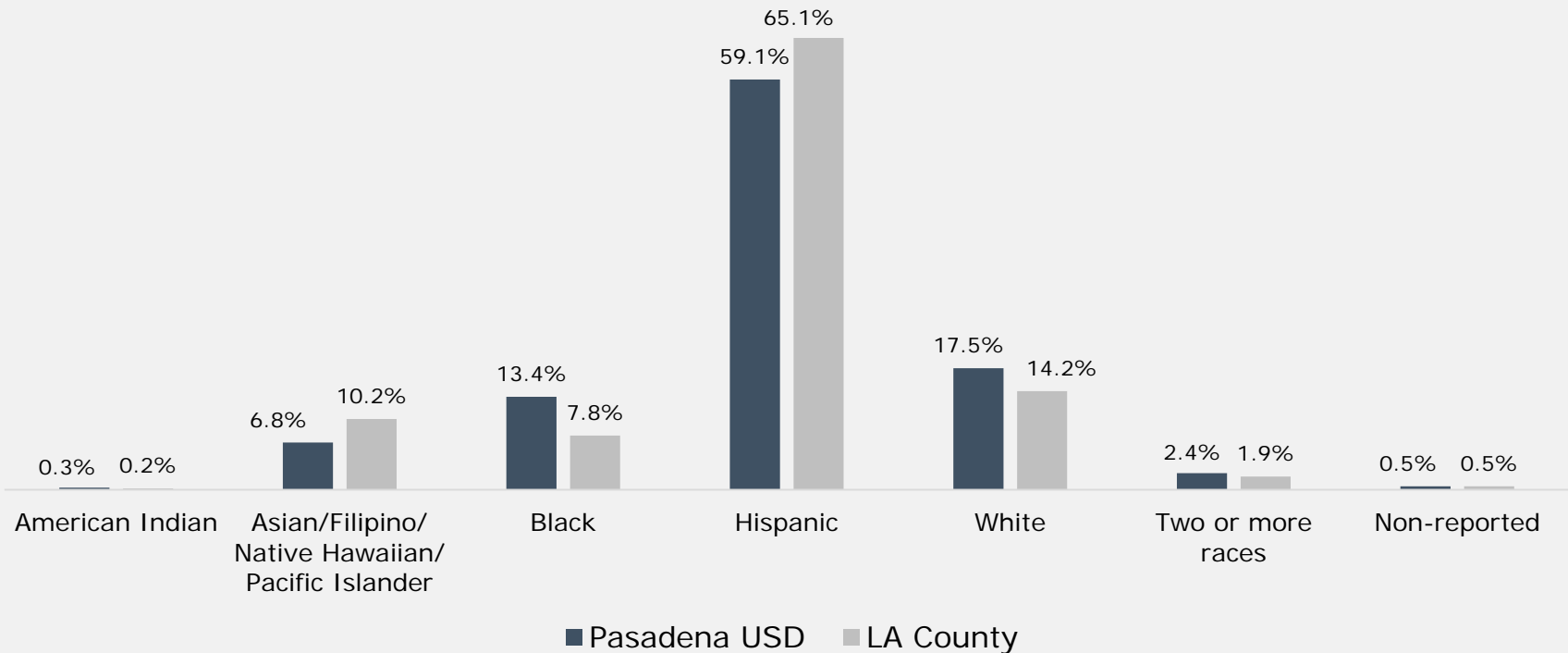

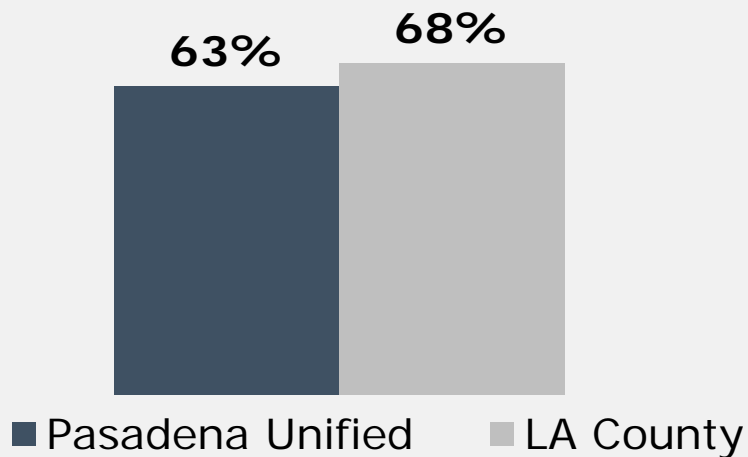
Race/ethnicity of Pasadena Unified School District students compared to Los Angeles County student population



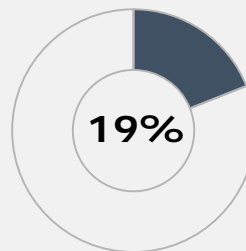

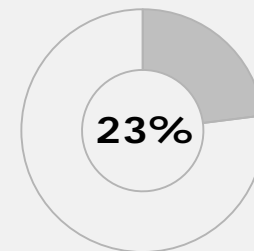
% of students eligible for Free and Reduced Price Meals

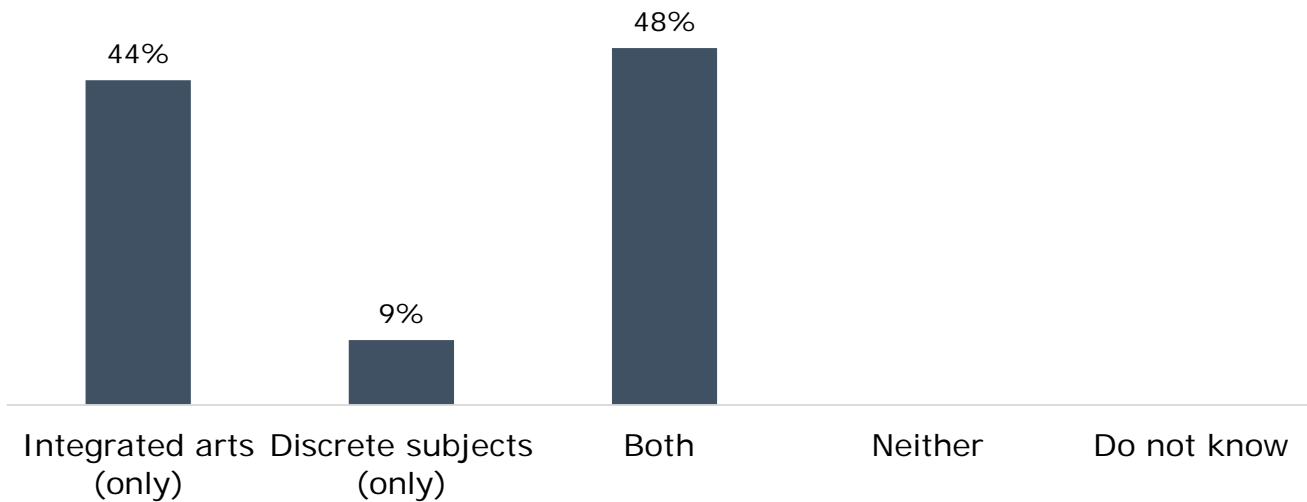

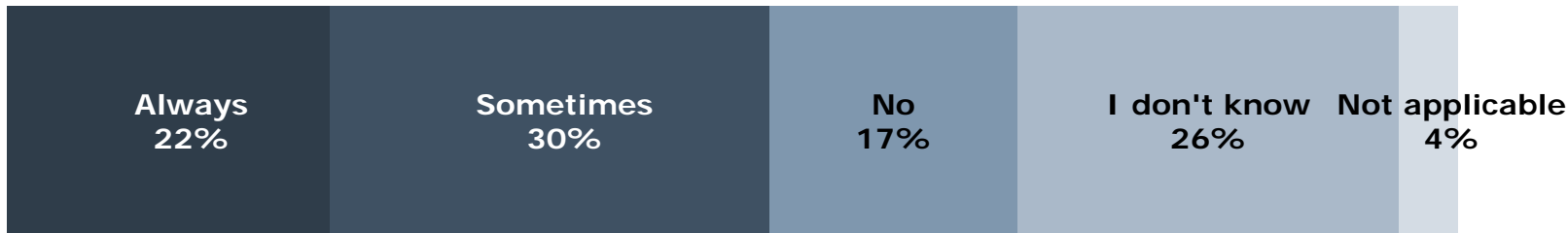

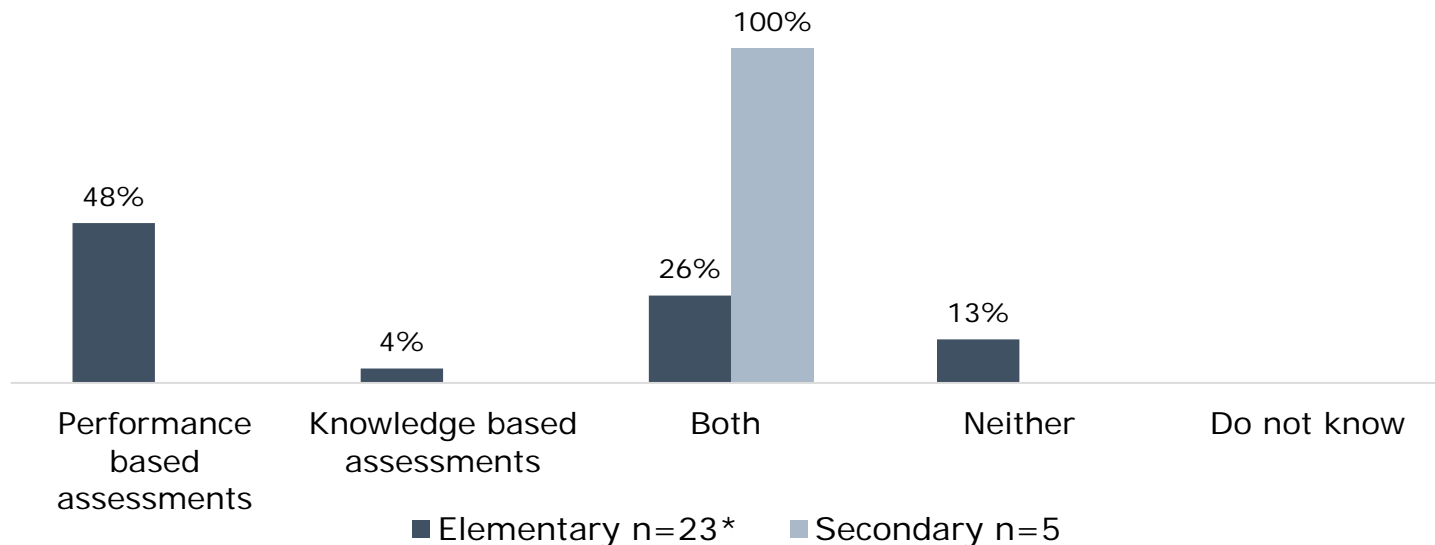
Percentage of schools using a shared written curriculum when more than one teacher is teaching an arts discipline (n=23)

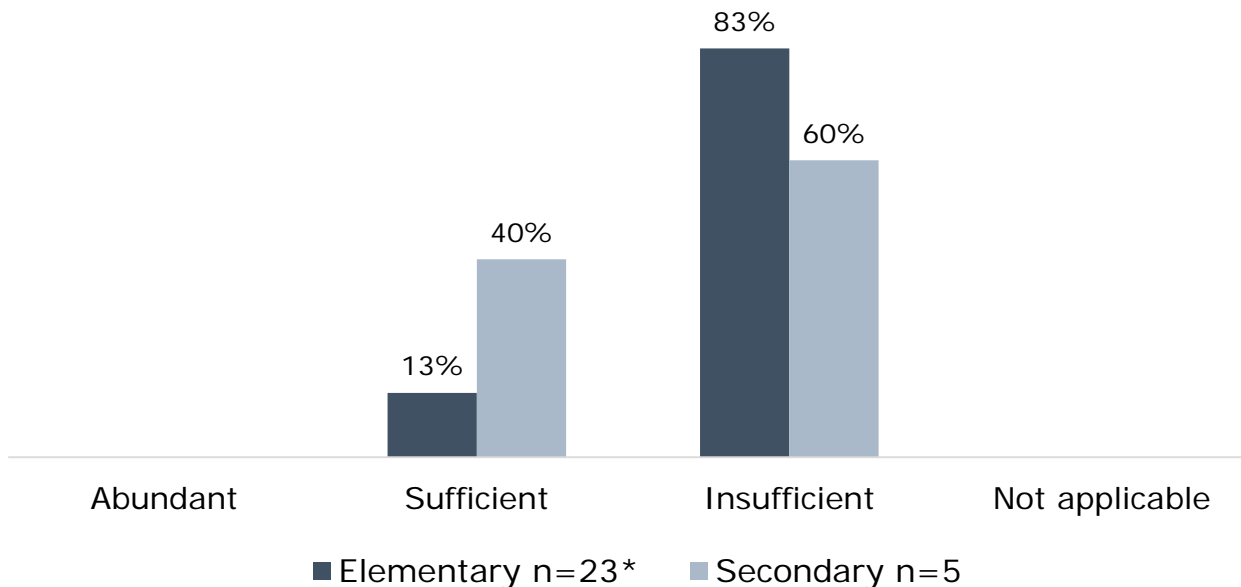



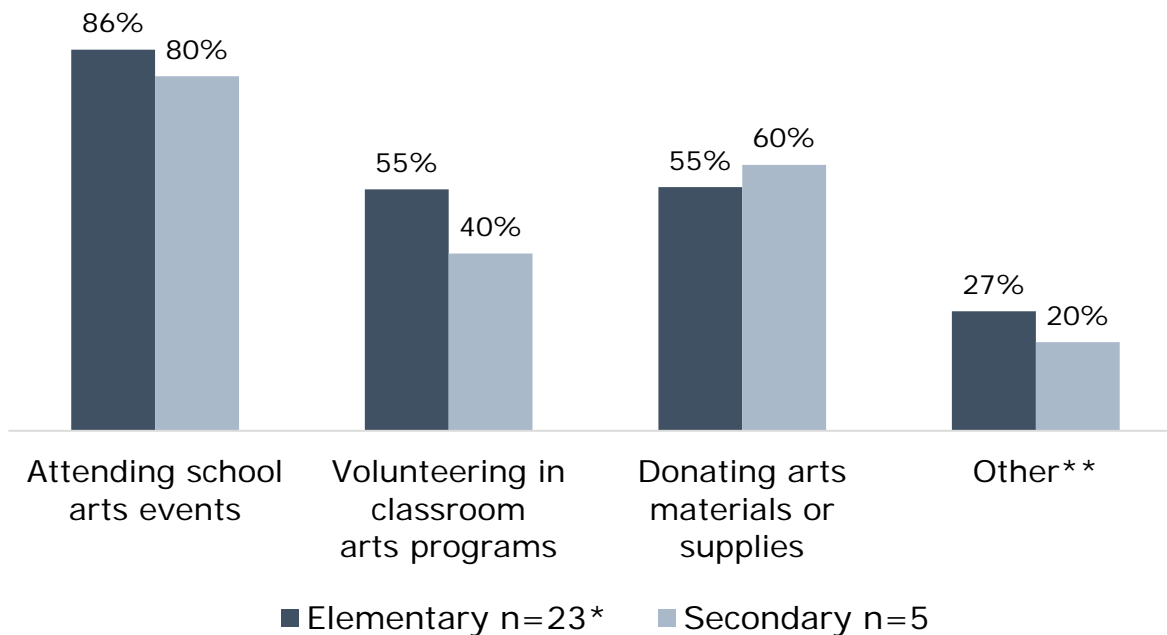

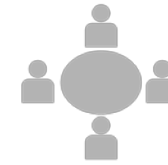

Thirteen elementary school principals identified successful components of their arts education offerings. Five principals identified the implementation of arts programs as a success. For instance, one school was able to create a program with a partnership between parents and teachers to offer art lessons. Other schools created a range of arts program such as a film program, band, and a Glee club. Some of these programs are sustained with fundraising such as food sales or grants to fund art education. Four principals mentioned receiving awards and participating in tournaments, events, and concerts as successes. Two principals identified the growth of art programs as a success.

Two principals listed successes of having an arts program at their secondary schools. One principal mentioned that the students are able to enjoy the classes, despite the limited funding and facilities.

Another principal was proud of the visual arts and media arts program as students have received awards and accolades through various contests.

Thirteen elementary school principals identified challenges implementing arts programs. Nine elementary school principals cited funding as the greatest barrier to providing arts instruction. Other challenges were time constraints to dedicate to the arts, the teachers' lack of skills to plan lessons integrating arts and high quality professional development. Three mentioned the lack of arts instructors as a challenge and two principals cited physical space as a challenge.

Findings & Considerations

Findings & Considerations

Findings

Arts education is not equitably distributed across the district. The number of FTE by school site ranged for visual arts from 0 to 3.0 at elementary schools and 0.2 to 3.5 at secondary schools. While the media arts total FTE for elementary schools is 1.0, for secondary it is 2.9. The total FTE for music is 16.5 for elementary and 12.7 for secondary schools. Dance and media arts are offered at a smaller number of schools compared to music, visual arts and theater.

After school programs offer varying arts programming. Differences exist across disciplines and grades:

- The percentage of after school programs that offer at least one arts discipline is 100% at secondary schools compared to 65% at elementary schools.
- Media Arts classes are offered only in 5% of elementary schools while dance, theater, and visual arts classes are offered in 35%.

School principals cited funding as the greatest barrier to providing arts instruction. Some principals also cited physical space as a challenge in arts education for elementary and secondary schools.



Considerations

What strategies and policies can the Pasadena Unified School District schools implement to ensure equal access to arts education? How many FTE teachers are needed to provide equitable arts instruction? Goals for a more equitable arts program could be set by:

- Arts discipline offered at each school
- FTE of trained arts teachers

What strategies can the Pasadena Unified School District implement to offer a wider range of arts offerings as part of their after school programming?

What specific strategies can Pasadena Unified School District schools adopt to address funding and space challenges? Can schools share funding resources or community partners that have supplied space for arts education?

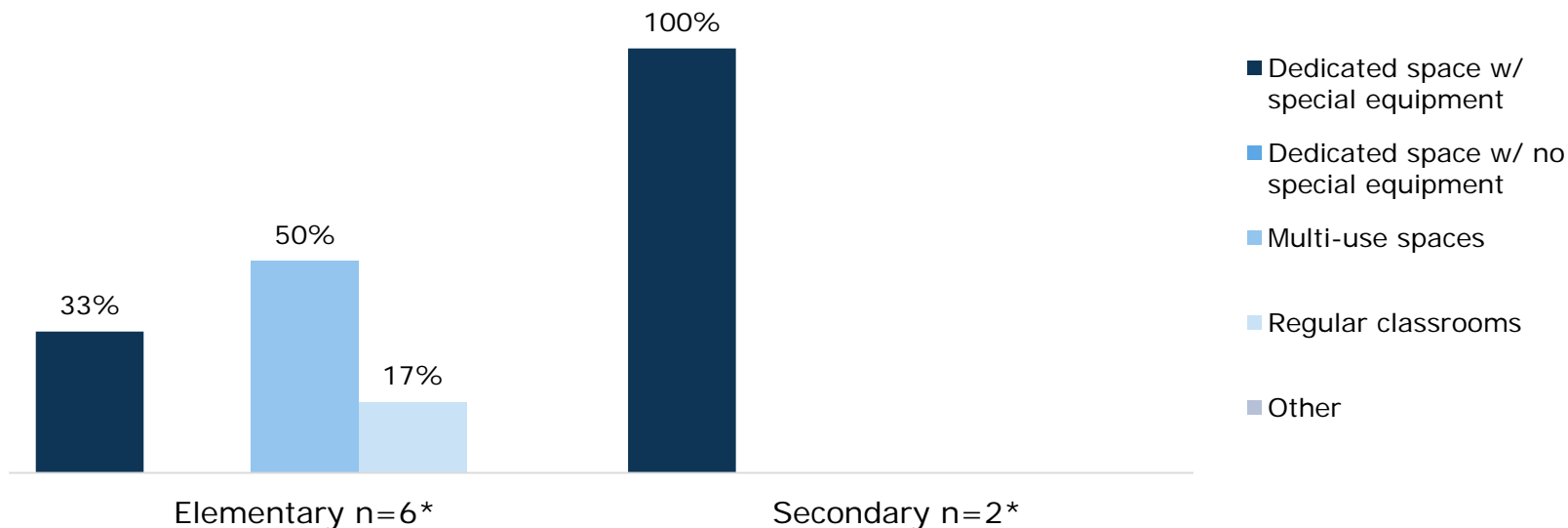

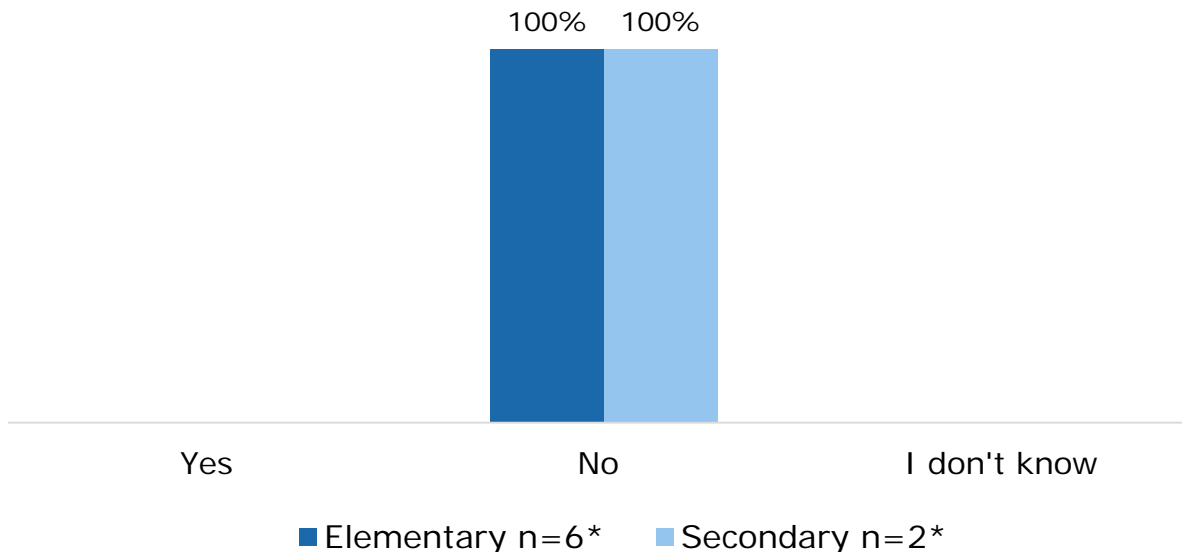

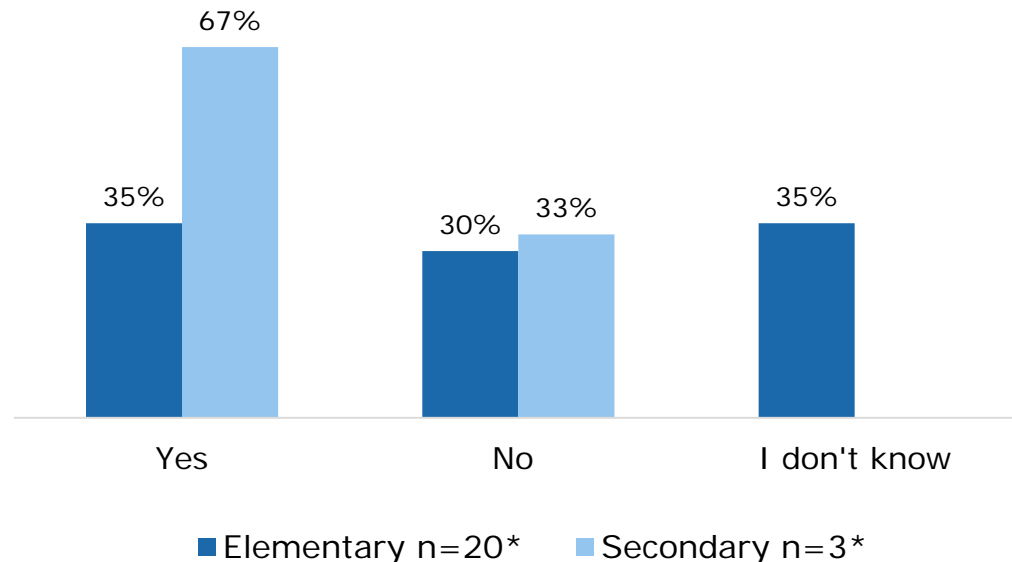

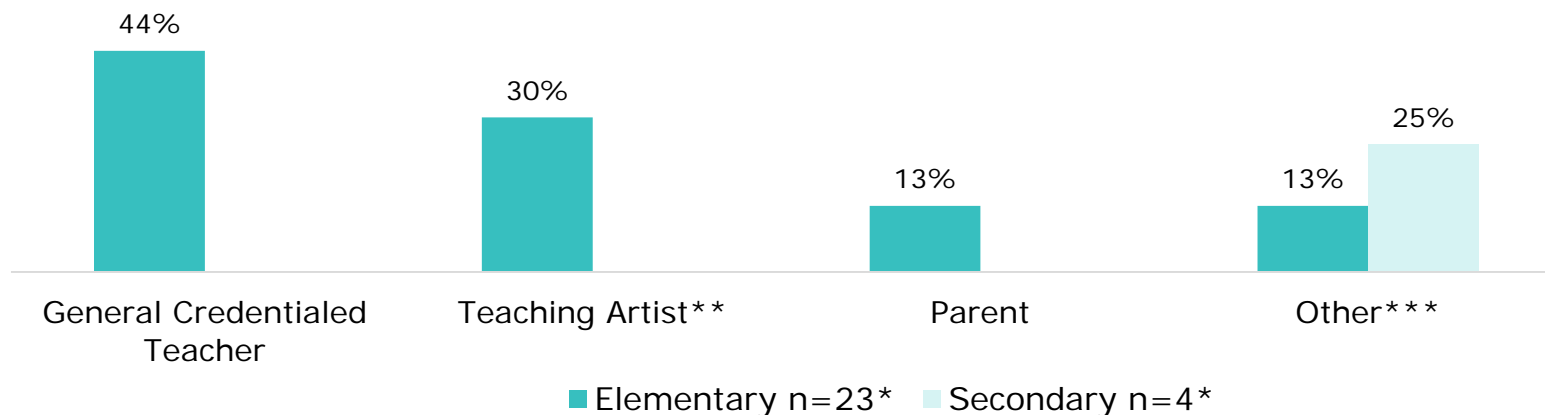

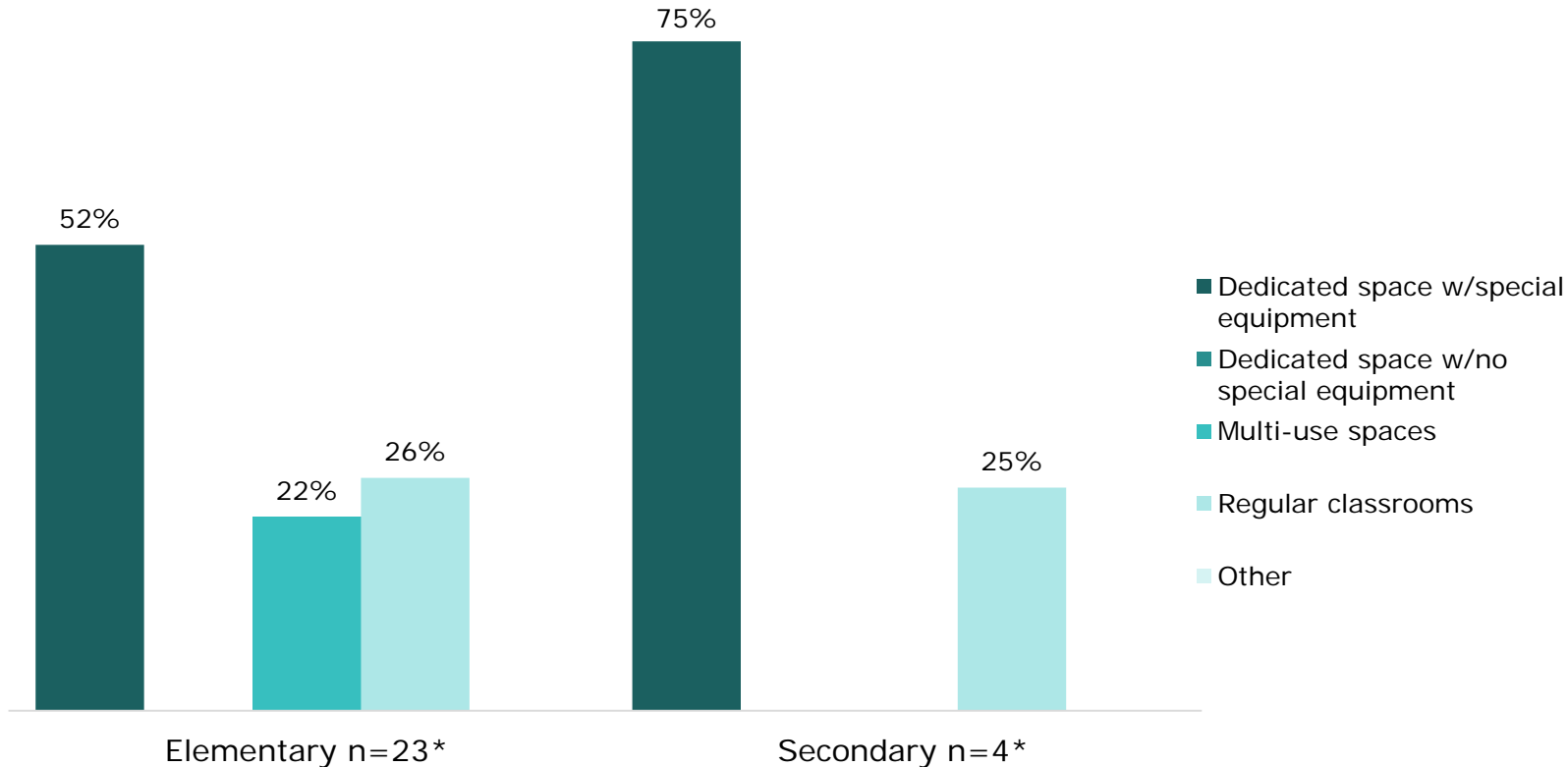

Location that best describes the space used for music instruction during the school day



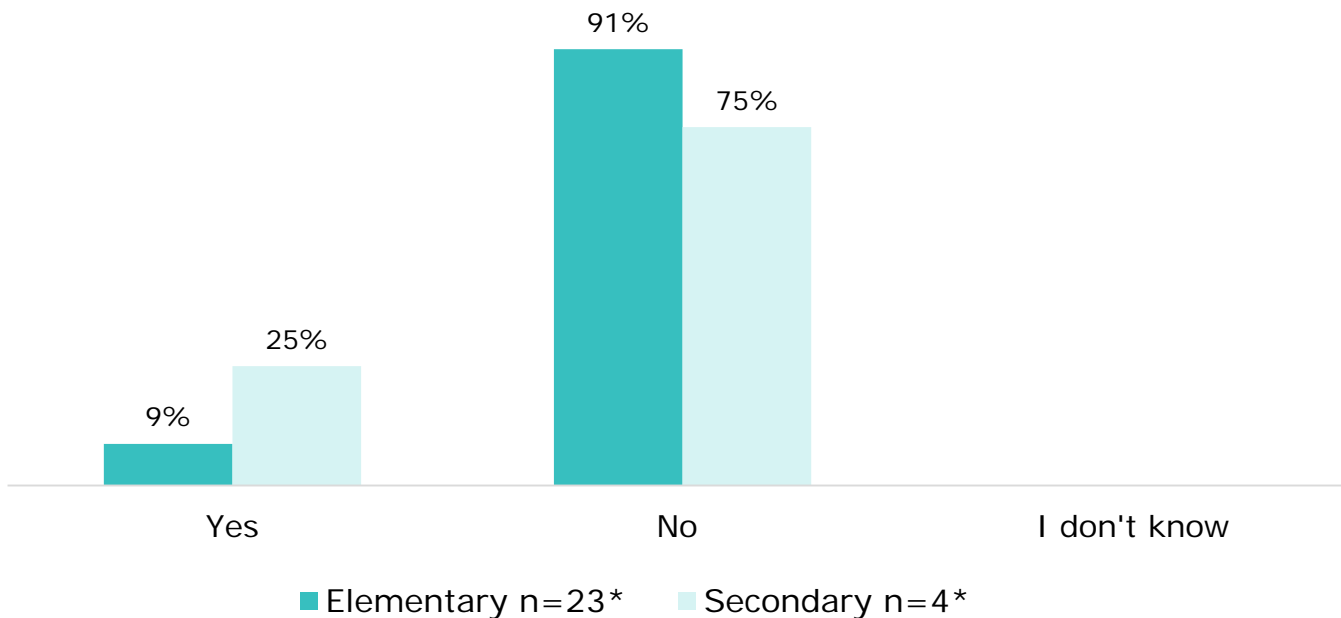

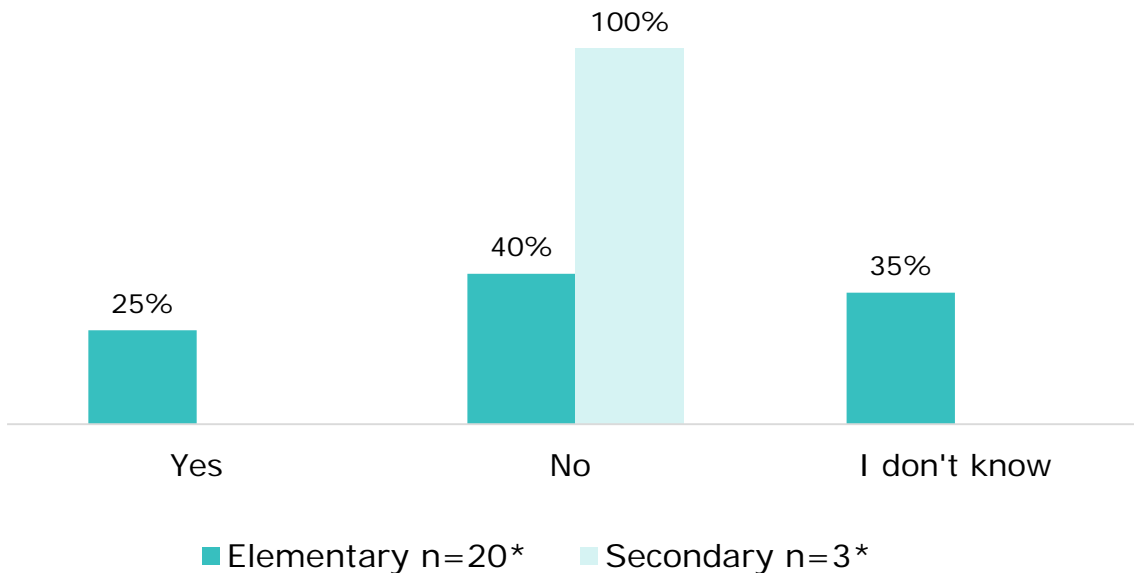

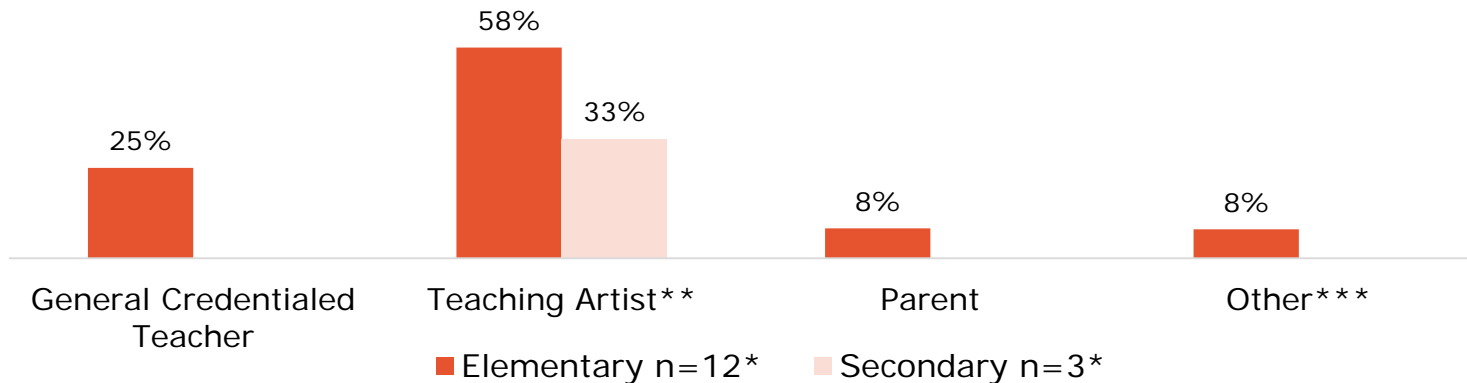

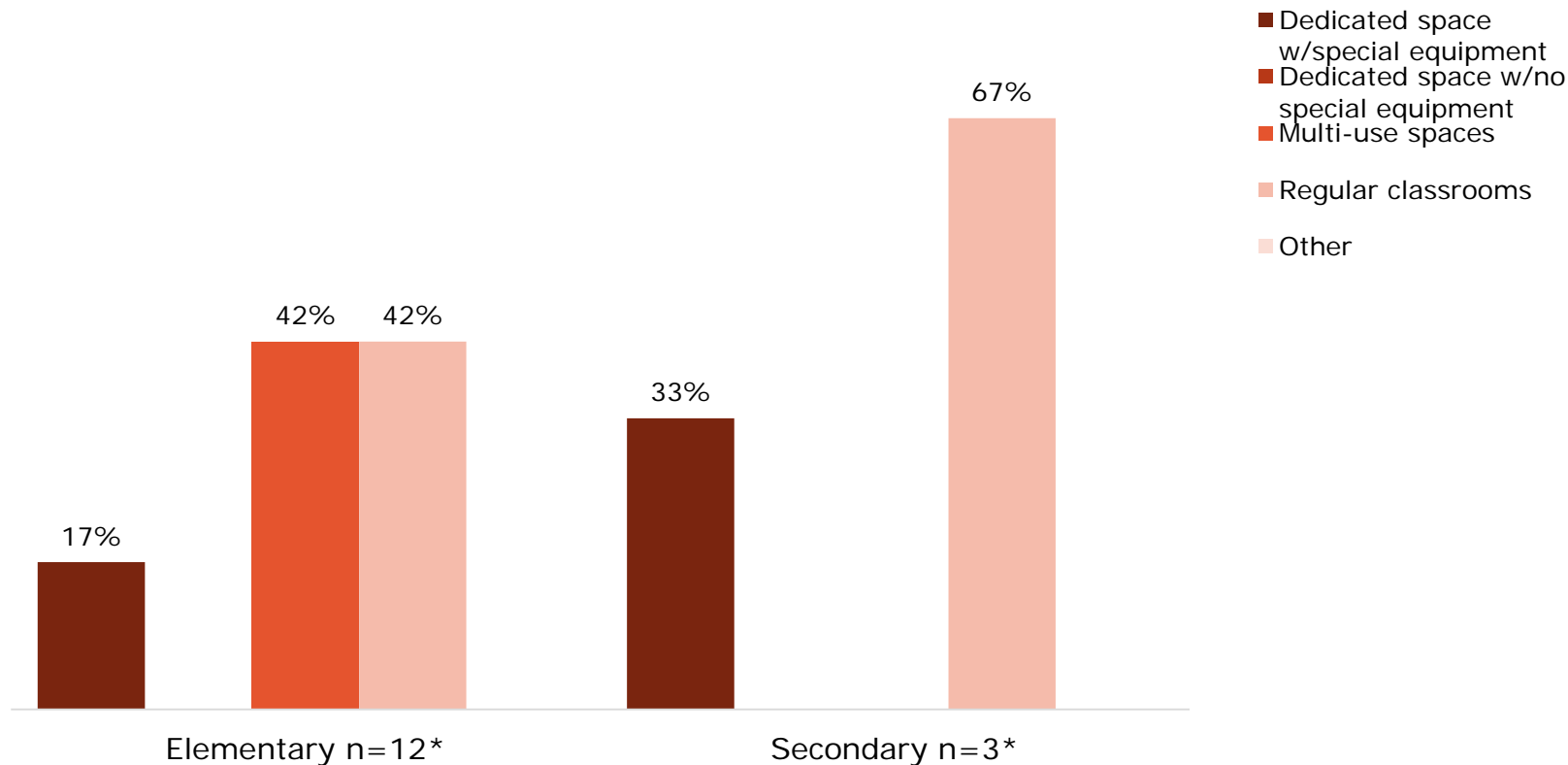

Location that best describes the space used for theater instruction during the school day



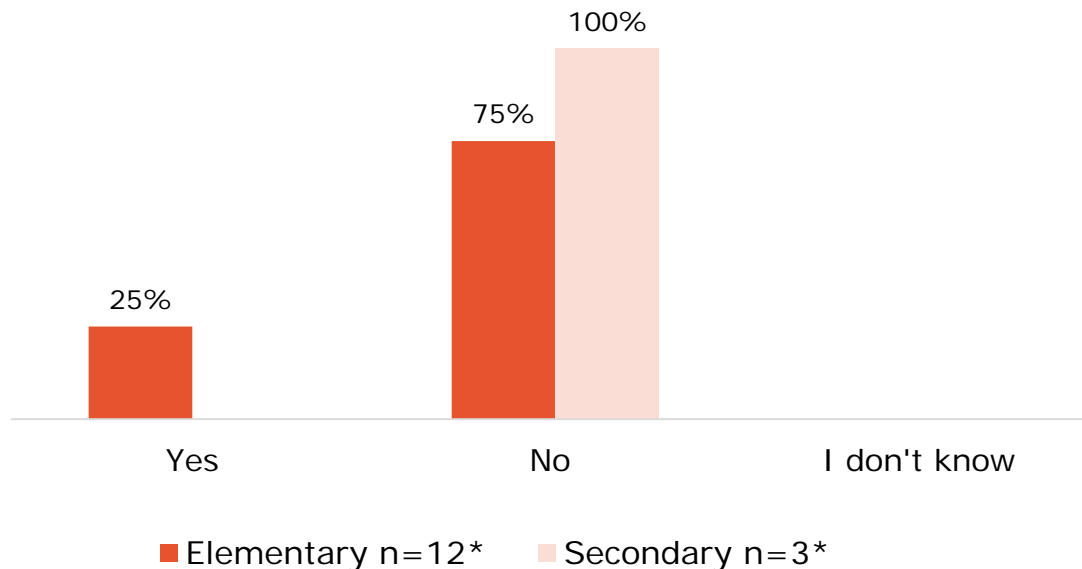

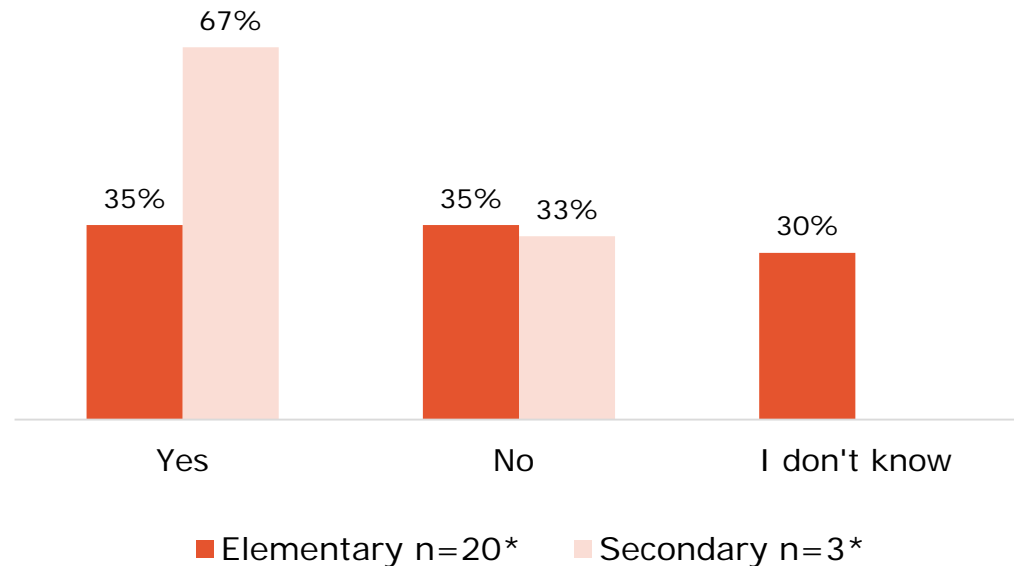

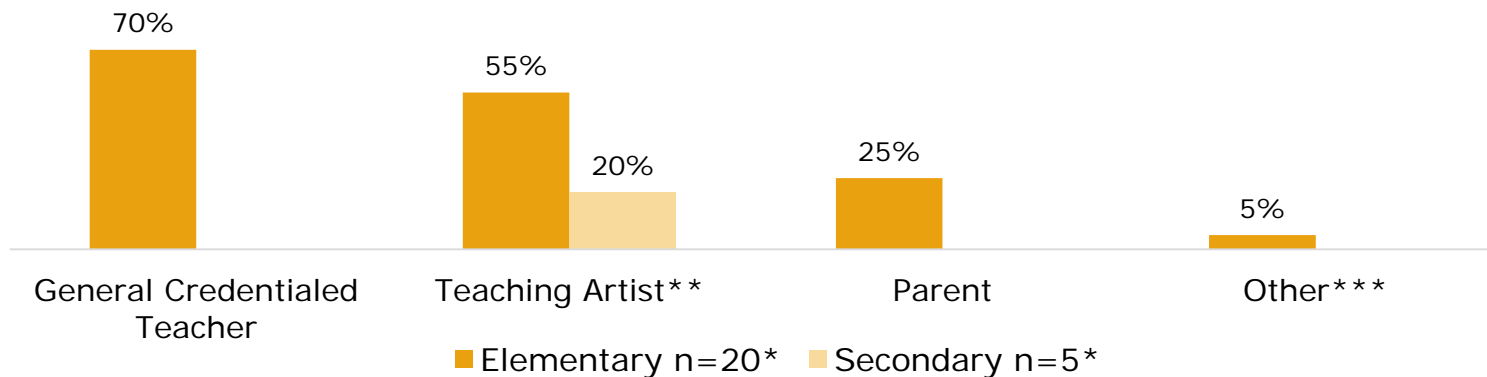

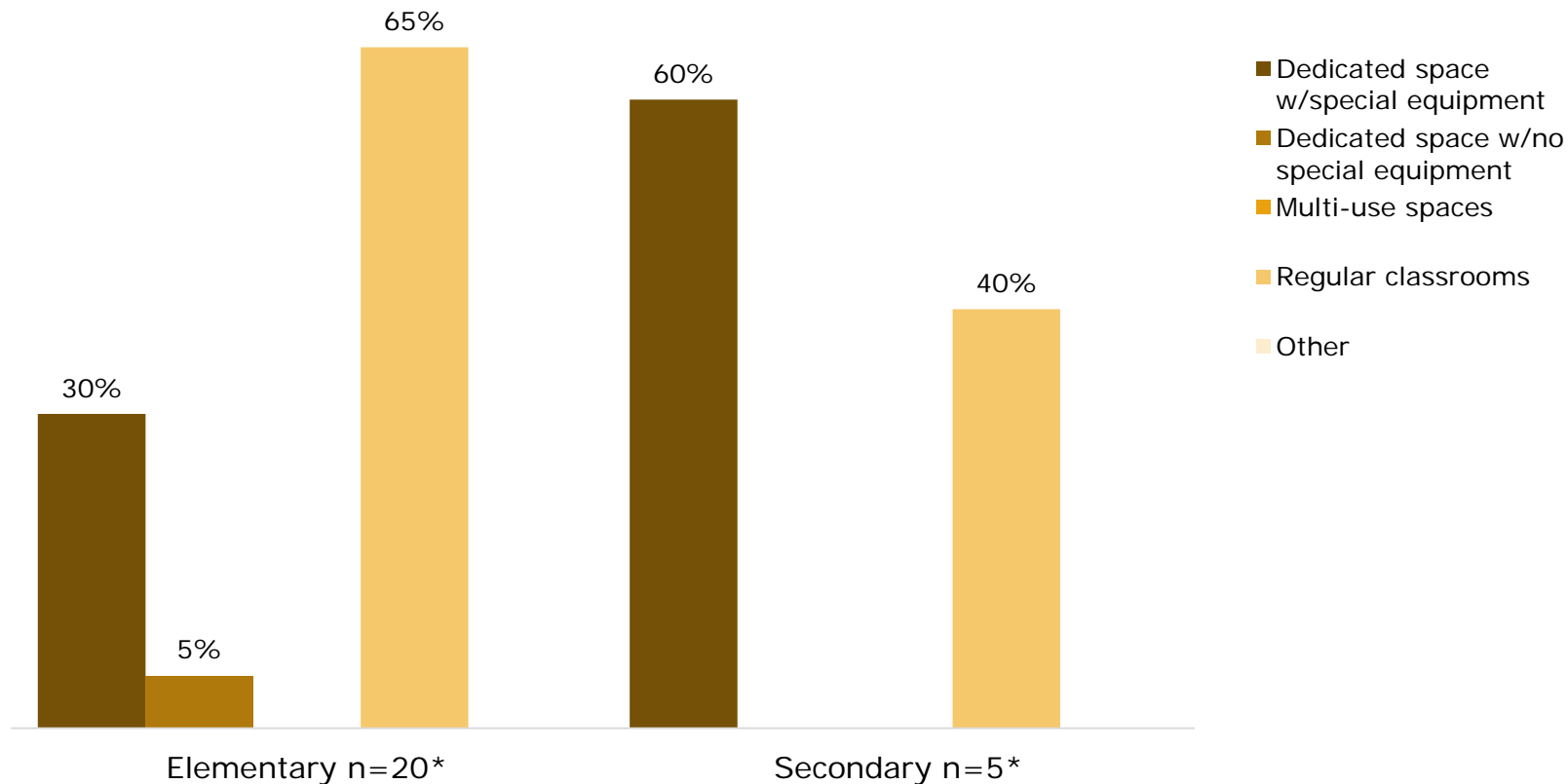

Location that best describes the space used for visual arts instruction during the school day



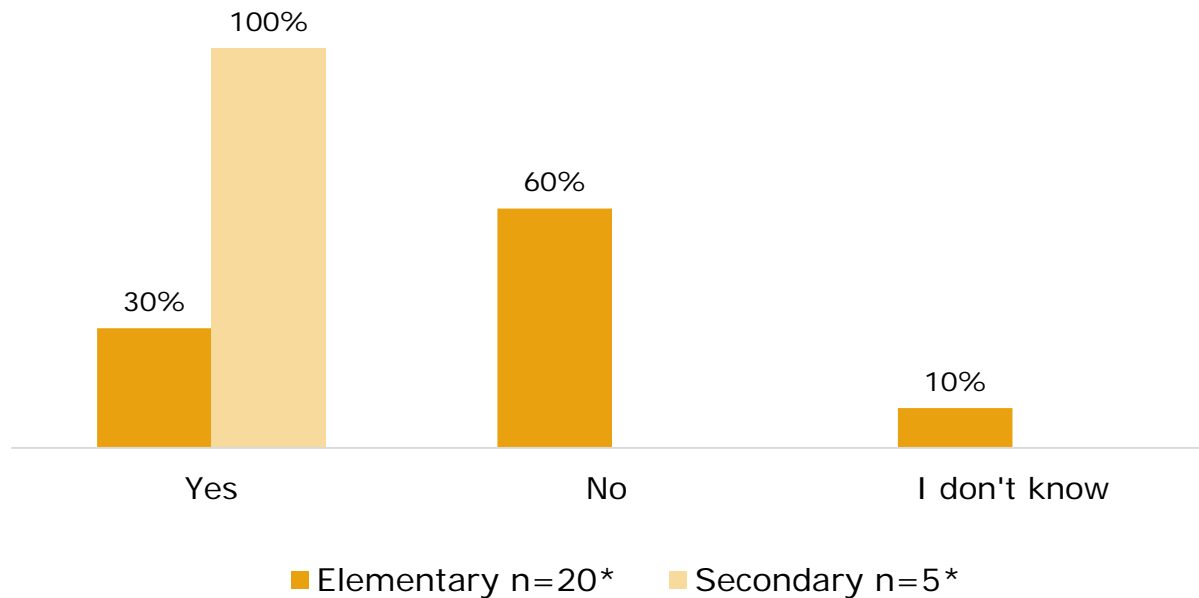

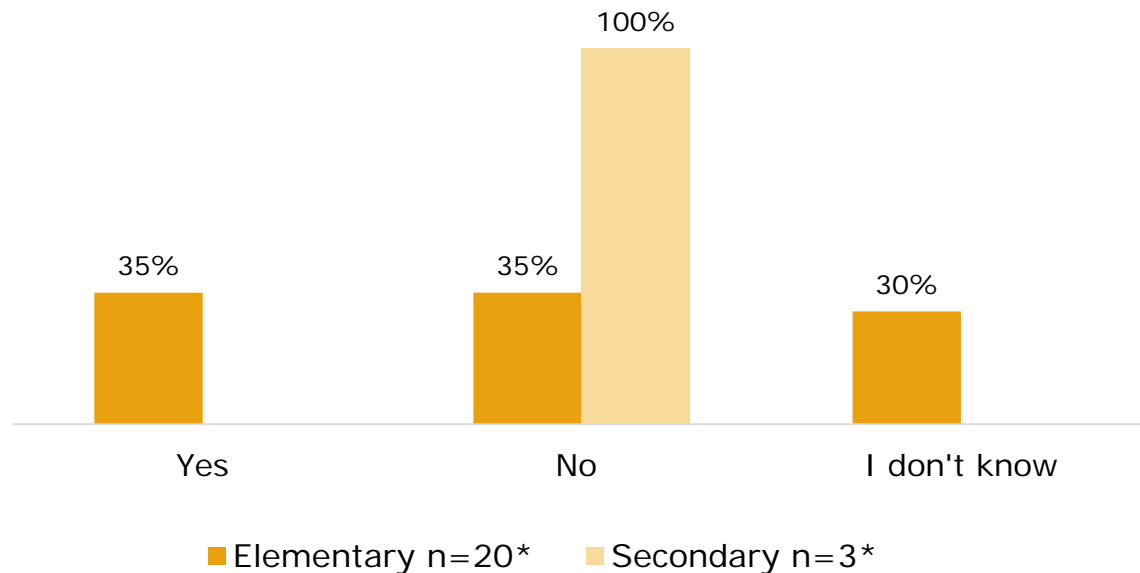

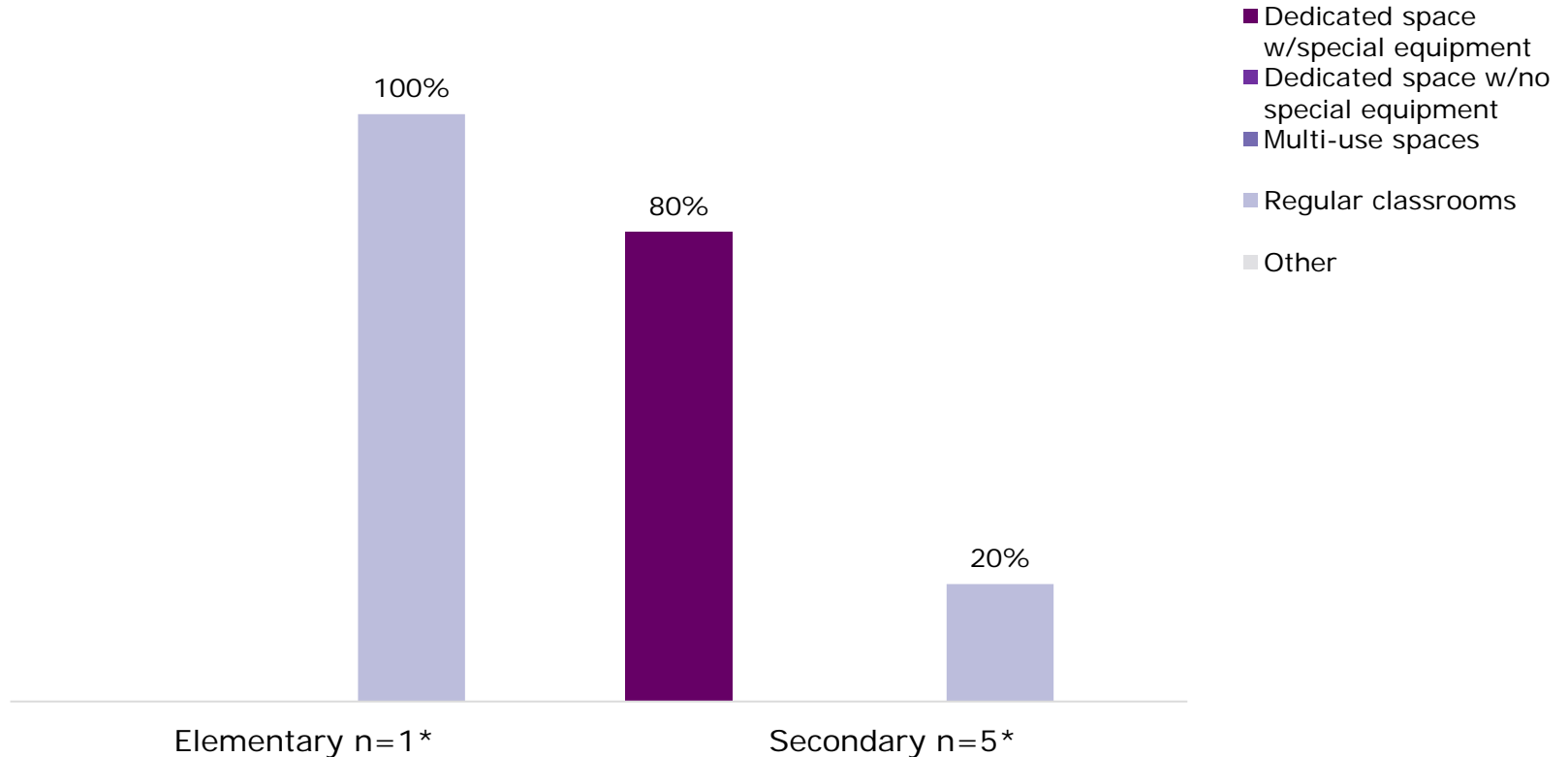

Location that best describes the space used for media arts instruction during the school day



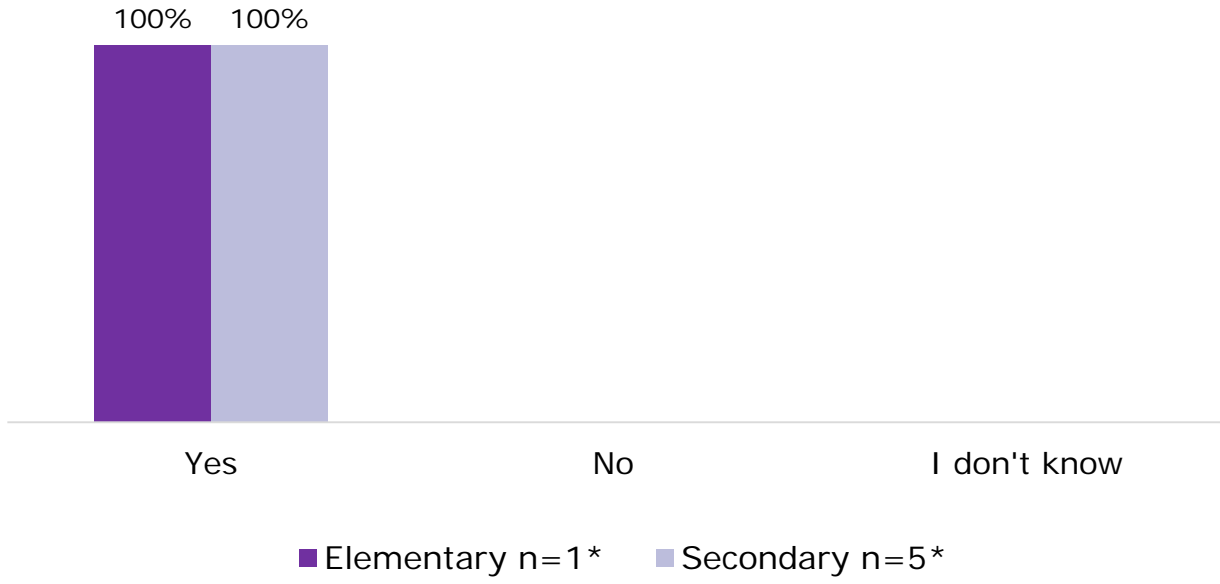

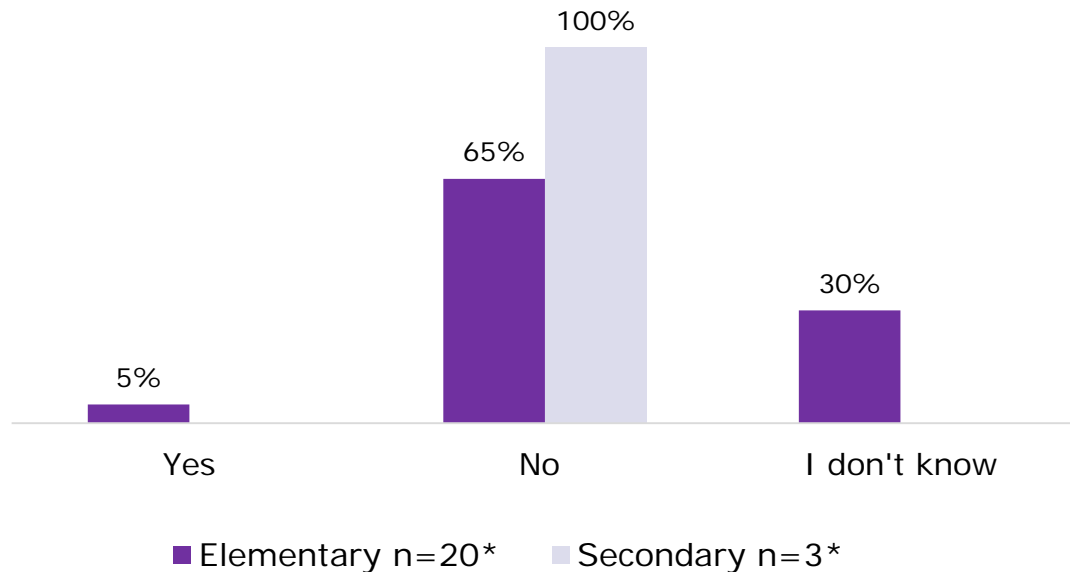
