What Makes Our School Unique?

Arts Magnet: At Altadena Arts Magnet, visual and performing arts are an integral part of a well-rounded education, boosting engagement and achievement. Altadena Arts is one of three schools in PUSD to receive a \$15 million dollar federal arts magnet grant. This grant puts us in the top 3% in the nation of elementary schools at which students receive instruction in all four art forms: Dance, Music, Theatre and Visual/Graphic. We integrate arts with academics for a rich, meaningful learning experience for all students.

French Dual Immersion: The goal is for students to become bilingual, bi-literate, bi-cognitive, culturally sensitive citizens of the world. With the 90/10 model, our students leave with skills that prepare them for success in a dynamic, competitive global society.

Supportive Culture: At Altadena Arts Magnet, children are taught how to think, not what to think. We are an Inclusion School which means all students regardless of their abilities are invited to participate in our general classroom setting. Our dedicated teachers use evidence-based approaches including, Balanced Literacy and Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports to:empower students by celebrating each child's unique abilities, perspectives, and interests, provide opportunities for voice and choice, so students feel control over their own learning, promote positive interactions with other students in a diverse, connected learning community, build on students' strengths to increase academic achievement and social-emotional competencies, and to prepare students for college and careers as illustrated in the PUSD Graduate Profile.

Arts Partnerships:

Every student builds a strong musical foundation through weekly classes taught by Harmony Project. Students experience fundamentals of dance with AMAN Dance, and students learn classical, modern, and contemporary technique from Lineage Dance. Students learn music composition with Southland Sings, and students in grades 3-5 may participate in band, orchestra and strings with district Music Specialist, Karen Klages. Armory Center for the Arts offers rich arts integrated experiences through Science and Math. Our teaching artist in residence, Ms. Liane Shih, mixed media artist, works with students in our Innovation Lab and in Room 13, our after school art club.
