What Makes Our School Unique?

Roosevelt prides itself on the technological advancements we offer students on a daily basis. We have over 240 newly purchased Google Chromebook laptops, and over 30 iPads. Students in Pre-K to 1st grade utilize the iPads and students in 2nd to 4th grades use the laptops. Students are exposed to technology on a daily basis by teachers who have access to their own personal laptops; students learn how to create power-points, type essays, do on-line research, and use education related programs such as Accelerated Reader and Lexia Reading. We have numerous family based school events including a carnival, jog-a-thon, and fundraisers at various businesses.

What Does Our School Offer?

Roosevelt is a high performing and high achieving school where we put a high emphasis on preparing students for the 21st Century. Students are taught the 4C's of Communication, Collaboration, Creativity, and Critical Thinking, and how to apply these concepts in every scenario they encounter in the classroom and in the real world. Our students are taught from Pre-K that going to college is their ultimate goal and that each day they are being prepared and given the tools to excel and achieve this goal. They are taught by a qualified staff highly trained in technology, problem-solving, and in the California Common Core standards. Students are taught a number of strategies to better grasp learning and apply their learning to grade level expectations in a safe, responsible, and respectful environment.
