- WHEN:** ***Deadline for Submissions*** is Friday, February 3 by 5:00 p.m.
Opening Reception is Friday, March 10, 6-9 pm
Exhibit Runs March 10 through March 19
ArtNight Pasadena is Friday, March 10 which will be our Opening Reception
- WHERE:** TBD (likely Corner Bakery Plaza again)

HOW TO PARTICIPATE

- ***Quality of artwork from each school is emphasized over quantity.*** Please gather your best work. We will not accept work that has been folded, rolled, or damaged.
- Art Representatives from each school should help select and coordinate the collection of artwork.
- Student participation is voluntary, and every attempt will be made to return all artwork to students.
- The Pasadena Unified School District and/or the Arts Education Office staff and/or its volunteers are not responsible for any loss or damage to student work.
- Fill out a Student Information Form for each work submitted and have the student write a brief (50-word max) statement about the work.
- Fill out the School Inventory Form – this Google Drive spreadsheet has been sent to your Arts Rep
- Drop-off from 10am to 5pm at the Ed Center, Arts Office, Room 219 on FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 3rd.

NUMBER OF WORKS ALLOWED (any size or media, emphasis is on quality)

- Elementary Schools (K-5) 10 artworks per school
- Middle Schools (6-8) 12 artworks per school
- K-8 Schools 22 artworks per school
- 6-12 Schools 32 artworks per school
- High Schools (9-12) 20 artworks per school

RESTRICTIONS

- No more than two entries per student
- No more than three of the same assignment unless the work is distinctly different
- Class projects are accepted as ONE entry with teacher name only, i.e. “Mrs. Turner’s 4th Grade Class”
- *Not all submitted artwork is guaranteed to be shown due to space limitations*

Guidelines on the Selection of Student Artwork

The PUSD Arts Education Office along with the District Arts Team and Community Arts Team (DAT/CAT) will once again be presenting our district-wide art show *No Boundaries*. Our two primary goals in presenting this exhibit are to represent every school, and to showcase the highest quality artwork in PUSD. Therefore, we offer the following guidelines to keep in mind as you select the submissions from your school. Thank you for supporting this exhibit and please call the Arts Education Office with any questions or concerns you might have at 626-396-3600, ext. 88123, or email shahin.nehal@pusd.us.

Coordinate the selection of student artwork based on the following criteria:

- The goal of No Boundaries is to showcase *artwork made at school or as part of a school assignment, not work done in outside art classes or programs, or at home.*
- *****Look for ORIGINAL work – work that has been produced directly by students -not copied. Ask yourself this question before you submit: Is this unique, and artfully done? Please do not submit mission projects, math graphs, health/growth charts, coloring book pages, etc.*****
- Both two dimensional and three dimensional works are accepted. Try to include a wide range of grades and media (watercolor, collage, drawings, etc.).
- Please do not add signage or write on the artwork. Every submission will have a uniform label, created by the Arts Office, displayed to the side of the artwork.
- Student statements are limited to a 50-word count. Prompts for student statements could be:
 - What inspired you to make this artwork?
 - What were you thinking about when you made this artwork?
 - What do you want people to know about your artwork?
- Less is MORE. Our goal is to show the BEST work from each school. You do not need to meet the maximum number of allowable submissions. If you only have six GREAT pieces, but ten are allowed, it is best to submit only six!
- When exhibiting work that requires special attention (clothing, digital installations, etc.), please contact the Arts Office in advance so that we can accommodate the artwork.
- Please note that Hot Glue is not a reliable adhesive. Projects made with hot glue tend to fall apart during transportation and exhibition. Please contact the Arts Office if you need help selecting the right adhesive for a project. Artworks that fall apart during installation may not be exhibited.

DISCLAIMER: Submission of student artwork to No Boundaries is voluntary. The PUSD Arts Education Office makes every effort to handle student work with the utmost care. However; artwork may be lost or damaged. Should Student, Parents/Guardian or Teacher determine artwork is too fragile for transport, or irreplaceable it should not be submitted. The Pasadena Unified School District, the Arts Education Office staff and/or its volunteers are not responsible for any loss or damage to student work. Thank you.

Please use the portfolio provided to schools to deliver two-dimensional artwork. If you do not have your portfolio from last year, please contact the Arts Office. Please pack three-dimensional works separately but clearly labeled with school name, including special instructions, directional signs, and/or hanging materials.
