## Overlap in Target Student Group Membership

2022-23 Fall Norm/Census Day

The table below summarizes the counts and percentage of overlap among students within target student groups (socio-economically disadvantaged, English learner, foster youth, and disabled) as well as students of Hispanic and African descent. Of all 14,152 TK-12 district students, $75.4 \%(10,669)$ were included in at least one PUSD target student group. The percentages for the table should be read by row, e.g. among PUSD's 10,156 socio-economically disadvantaged students, $18.7 \%$ of them ( 1,900 students) were also English Learners.
