### Introduction

In spring 2018 PasadenaLEARNs conducted its second annual parent survey to gather parent feedback and to guide continuous improvement efforts for the K-8 program. Surveys were distributed to parents on-site and parents with more than one child in LEARNs were asked to submit one survey for each child to capture how well the program was meeting the needs of each individual student. A total of 1,310 surveys were completed in all, which is a marked increase from the 983 surveys returned in the 2016-17 school year survey administration. One response from Madison Elementary was excluded due to data entry errors; the remaining 1,309 survey responses are summarized in Table 1 below by school site.

The largest proportions of total surveys came from Longfellow (9.6%), Washington (8.7%), Madison (7.3%) and Field (6.0%) Elementary schools.

### Survey Results

Table 2 summarizes the grade levels of the students represented in the survey. Kindergarten (17.6%) had the largest share of responses of all grade levels. Nearly 84% of all students were between K and 5<sup>th</sup> grade and 17% represented the middle school grades (6-8).

### Reasons for Enrolling in PasadenaLEARNs

Parents were asked about their reasons for enrolling their child in PasadenaLEARNs. Responses are summarized in table 3 below. Parents were asked to select as many reasons as applied, therefore the percentages represent the proportion of all survey respondents who selected each reason and do not sum to 100%.

In 2017-18 the most cited reason for enrolling a child in LEARNs was again for homework assistance (76.2%) with three-quarters of respondents choosing this reason. A large majority, nearly 66%, also identified the need for child care as a reason for enrolling their student in LEARNs. Enrichment opportunities was selected as a reason by a little over half (56.5%) and about a third (36.6%) said fitness activities were a reason.

Parents were also given the option to write in any "other" reasons they have for enrolling their child in LEARNs and 80 respondents (6%) did list one or more other reasons for participating in LEARNs. These reasons are summarized in table 4.

The largest number of parents, 24, wrote in reasons having to do with the high quality of the program and/or satisfaction with prior participation in the program. The next most commonly listed reason (20) was to expose the student to further opportunities for social interactions with their peers. Ten parents identified their work schedule as a reason for enrolling their child. Eight and 7 parents respectively, listed the sports and music programs.



#### Satisfaction with Program Components and Staff


Figure 2. Parent satisfaction with program components

Parents were asked to rate their level of satisfaction with three major components of the LEARNs program: homework assistance, enrichment activities, and the LEARNs staff. Ratings were made on a 6-point Likert-type scale ranging from very satisfied to very dissatisfied and are summarized in figure 2. "Very satisfied" and "satisfied" responses are grouped together for easier interpretation. Overall, satisfaction with program components were overwhelmingly positive and increased even further in this second annual administration over the 2016-17 year.

About 87% of parents were satisfied with the homework assistance, 94% were satisfied with the enrichment activities, and nearly all respondents, 97% reported being satisfied with the LEARNs program staff. Satisfaction with enrichment activities and LEARNs staff increased 7% and 8%, respectively.

Parents were also asked to rate their level of agreement with four statements about the program on a 6-point scale ranging from strongly agree to strongly disagree. Responses are summarized in figure 3 below.

The responses mirrored the last administration, with overwhelmingly positive experiences with the program. Taking 'strongly agree' and 'agree' responses together, nearly all parents (97.5%) agreed that LEARNs provides a safe place for their child. About 93% of parents agreed that the program motivates students to learn and about 94% agreed that it provides a supportive learning environment for students. About 87% of parents agreed that LEARNs encourages them to be an active partner with the school in educating their child.

At the end of the survey parents were provided an opportunity in an open-ended question to write in any additional comments or suggestions for the program and 386 parents did write in comments. The content of the comments was analyzed to identify common themes and are summarized in table 4. Each survey respondent could contribute multiple thoughts or suggestions, therefore there were a larger number of themes summarized than the number of parent respondents providing the feedback.

The majority of mentions, 359 in all, centered around praise and expressions of gratitude for the program and staff: 171 either non-specific or broadly about the program, 132 specifically calling out the efforts and quality of the staff and youth leaders, 32 comments about having observed academic/social gains, 16 about having observed improvement in students' homework, and 8 comments about the value of the program in terms of cost or convenience to parents.

All together the remaining 122 comments consisted of suggestions and opportunities for program improvement. The most common suggestion which was made about 47 times was for more time or assistance with homework. The next most popular suggestions were for more opportunities for physical activity or outdoor play (13) and for more enrichment activities (11).

#### Satisfaction with Program Components and Staff by School Site

On the following page, table 5 summarizes parents' reasons for enrolling their children in LEARNs, their satisfaction with major LEARNs program components, and their experience with LEARNs by school site. For reasons for enrolling in LEARNs, what is reported is the proportion of parents from the school who selected each reason. Satisfaction ratings combine "very satisfied" and "satisfied" answers and agreement ratings combine "strongly agree" and "agree" answers.
